For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control. So do not be ashamed of your testimony to our Lord, nor of me, a prisoner for his sake; but bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God.”

(2 Timothy 1:6-8)

Are the scraps from one's table enough to be fed on? Are the scraps from God's table enough for our salvation. Are the scraps from our table enough to show God how much we praise and adore Him?

Last weekend we have heard the story of Lazarus and rich man. Both had the opportunity to live and partake in the life of this world. One was “blessed” with worldly riches, the other was blessed with eternal riches. While they used the treasures entrusted them, they were giving testimony of their true desires. We are the “rich” people, who have the whole world given to us, with its material and natural resources, with our ability to use them, with our intellectual properties where we can reason and have our say. Lazarus – or Jesus, who though he is “rich”, became “poor” so that we can have eternal life.

It is Jesus, who is at our doorposts begging for the scraps from the table prepared for us by God himself and who tells us today that if all we had is faith the size of the mustard seed, we would have all we need. The disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith. Disciples of Jesus want more – God gives them an advice and a reminds them they already have the treasures needed to fulfill their mission.

In a world full of possibilities and options for who we are and what we know, we find ourselves sometimes quite overwhelmed. Perhaps we sometimes find ourselves at the Thanksgiving table full of different dishes, pies, deserts and meats. And yet, after a while, we find ourselves overstuffed and tired. We look for a soft place to rest. Jesus offers us a place of rest in the business of our life. It seems strange to get up from the well-set table and look for a place of solitude, but that is exactly what we sometimes need. After a bit of rest, we notice how many different dishes we have not tried yet and how hungry we still are. We find a place of rest for our souls and minds in the midst of the Church community, at the Eucharistic Altar. Jesus offers us a remedy for our tiredness and solution to our drive for more in the beauty of the sacraments and the quietness of the time with God in prayer. Compared to the riches of the world, the tranquility of the church might be very simple and not much at first. But give it a little time, and you will notice how rich this setting really is.

The Facts

- IM 27 only prescribes a \$100 penalty for those under the age of 21 who use or possess marijuana. This is less than your average speeding ticket and will not be a helpful deterrent against minors using the drug.
- In Colorado for ages 12 and older, marijuana usage increased 26% and is 61% higher than the national average.
- The #1 drug associated with a child's death is marijuana.
- In Colorado marijuana is found in 34% of the teens that die by suicide age 15-19.
- Traffic deaths increase: drivers tested positive for marijuana increased 138%.
- Adolescent marijuana use is associated with increased depression, suicide, and psychosis.

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Hab 1:2-3; 2:2-4 | 2 Tm 1:6-8, 13-14 | Lk 17:5-10

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

The prophet Habakkuk lived seven centuries before Christ, yet his words could well be ours today: “I cry out to you, ‘Violence!’ but you do not intervene.” Do we sometimes feel as though strife in our communities, and even within our own families, is more than we can handle? Like the prophet, we may ask, “How long, O Lord? I cry for help but you do not listen.” Indeed, we may feel our prayers are not being answered. Perhaps it is simply that they are not “answered” in the manner and timeframe in which we wish they would be. Although “God’s time” and his plan for our lives may seem mysterious or discouraging, it is by continuing to bring our concerns to God in prayer that we can actually help our faith grow and mature. We see countless examples of people who remain faithful in spite of hardship, misfortune and loss. Let us take time today, as the disciples did, to pray and ask Jesus to “increase our faith.” In simply turning to the Lord, we exhibit faith that, like a tiny mustard seed, has great power and can be a source of strength to ourselves and those around us. It is in faith in Christ that we find hope.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I find today’s Gospel reading so reassuring. Even just a tiny speck of faith can move mountains. Or, in this case, uproot a mulberry tree and plant it in the sea! Working for a Catholic magazine, I’m privileged to write about people with a deep and abiding faith, one they freely share with others through their example and by sharing their stories. I bet we can all point to a friend or family member who exhibits the kind of faith so strong that it rubs off on others they encounter. Jesus reminds us that even a little faith can have a huge impact – not only on our lives but on others. We can share it by offering to pray for those facing a challenge, talking to God when we feel overwhelmed, and opening our hearts to the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and in the faces of the people we encounter each day.

PRAY Even the prophet Habakkuk and the disciples experienced “off” days where faith eluded them. But the psalmist reminds us to keep showing up in prayer: “If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.” Especially in moments of despair, bring your concerns to God in prayer.
