Luke 17:16a

I find it interesting when I go look up the definition of a word, and it simply uses a variation of the word to define it. Take the word "gratitude". On dictionary.com, it defines gratitude as "the quality or feeling of being *grateful*". Okay, so how does it define grateful? As "warmly or deeply appreciative of kindness or benefits received; thankful."

Gratitude is part of a healthy spiritual life. It is found everywhere in the bible. In the gospel reading for this Sunday, ten lepers met Jesus at a distance, raising their voices, saying "Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!" And he sends them off to the priests to confirm they are cured. But one, on the way to the priests, realizing he had been healed, instead returns to Jesus, and thanks him. This is just one example of gratitude we find in the bible.

Studies have shown the power of gratitude. According to an article on psychologytoday.com, "Psychologists find that, over time, feeling grateful boosts happiness and fosters both physical and psychological health." "People who are grateful feel less pain, less stress, suffer insomnia less, have stronger immune systems, experience healthier relationships, and do better academically and professionally. Overall, it can boost both your mental and your physical health." "One study suggests that spending only a few minutes engaging in a gratitude activity, ..., can motivate you to make healthy food choices."

But more importantly, gratitude to God, is even more important. Here are what a few of the saints have to say about gratitude:

- "In all created things discern the providence and wisdom of God, and in all things give Him thanks." – St. Teresa of Avila
- "The secret of happiness is to live moment by moment and to thank God for what He is sending us every day in His goodness." – St. Gianna Beretta Molla
- "Thank God ahead of time." Bl. Solanus Casey
- "Would that I could exhaust myself in acts of thanksgiving and gratitude towards this Divine Heart, for the great favor He shows us." – St. Margaret Mary Alacoque
- "Get used to lifting your heart to God, in acts of thanksgiving, many times a
 day. Because he gives you this and that. Because you have been despised.
 Because you haven't what you need or because you have. Thank him for
 everything, because everything is good." St. Josemaria Escriva

If you are not already taking at least a few minutes every day, to show God gratitude for all he has done for you, start today. First thing in the morning, throughout the day, and the last thing at night before going to sleep. While paragraph 2094 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church states "One can sin against God's love in various ways: ... ingratitude fails or refuses to acknowledge divine charity and to return him love for love", more importantly, showing God gratitude every day, strengthens your relationship with God, and helps you develop an everyday attitude of gratitude.



A Visit to Our Sister Parishes




Who is that Retired priest?

Fr. Dan served in many parishes including Blessed Sacrament, Holy
Cross, St. Mary Star of the Sea, St. Therese of the Little Flower, St.
John the Evangelist, St. Margaret's, All Saints, Sacred Heart, St.
Luke, St. Joseph, St. Therese, St. Catherine, St. Joseph,
Immaculate Conception, St. Patrick, St. Mary, St. Bonaventure,
and St. Michael. He served as the Defender of the Bond, Vicar
General, Vicar for Clergy, and as the Judicial Vicar for the Diocese
of Rapid City. He was a chaplain for the Pennington County Fire
Fighters Assoc. and the Rapid City Fire Dept. He retired in 2022.

Msgr. Michael Woster

Ordained June 11, 1982 at Cathedral Our Lady of Perpetual Help Msgr. Woster served many parishes including St. John the Evangelist, Our Lady of Perpetual Help Cathedral, St. Michael, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, Immaculate Conception, St. Isidore, St. Anne, St. Joseph, St. Paul, St. Mary Star of the Sea, and the Newman Center. He was a chaplain for Ellsworth Air Force Base. He also served as Vicar General, Judicial Vicar and Moderator of the curia for the Diocese of Rapid City, he served as the Administrator for the Diocese while awaiting a new Bishop. He received the title of Monsignor from Pope John Paul II in 1995. He retired in 2022.
