"He said, 'Then I beg you, father, send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they too come to this place of torment.' But Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.' He said, 'Oh no, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.'''

(Luke 16:27-31)

The Eucharist Revival provides for us many new opportunities to learn the meaning of the sacrifice, generosity and active participation. As we pray, as we listen and as we learn to reach out, we continue serving God and each other with Mercy of the Father. The life of the parish depends heavily on the work of many through ministries we participate in and through generosity we show when we contribute out of our resources. Humbleness is a great trait in one's life. It is not an easy quality of life to achieve as it will challenge our individualism, but it is not impossible to gain. Many of us practice humbleness when we need to be seen by a physician, or when we get lost and we need to ask for direction. In the spiritual world the gift of humbleness calls us to look up to God for guidance and assistance. The first Beatitude starts with being "poor in Spirit" meaning relying on God rather than on ourselves.

Today's Gospel passage brings us to two men; Lazarus and the rich man. Both of them play an important role in the message God wants us to keep in our hearts. Lazarus, a beggar, and a sick man, realizing he cannot take care of himself relies on the help and "graciousness" of the rich man. He is patient and all he wants is the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. He suffers greatly but realizing that he needs to ask for help, he puts his ego aside and searches for relief to his dilemma. The rich man on the other hand enjoys life. From time to time he probably assists the poor but most likely without too much of concern. So, when he finds himself in the predicament of the netherworld, he asks for relief for himself first. Realizing he is not going to get what he wants he starts thinking of his brothers. But as Abraham says, they have the prophets and knowledge to avoid what is uncomfortable in the life to come. But if they do not want to listen, nothing or no one will be able to change their hearts.

Humbleness challenges our ego; it requires us to step aside in our wisdom and riches and comfort and allow God to work in our lives. We work hard on making our lives good and meaningful while we live in this world. Let us also work hard on making the gift of eternal life meaningful as well. Let us search for God in Scripture, Mass, and the wisdom of others. In our action let us be life-giving people who are ready to step aside so that others may be seen. In many ways our parish and every one of you have been a great inspiration to many through your use of talents, treasure, and your goodness. Please, help us continue the work of the parish as you respond generously through your prayers, active participation in many groups, as well as financial contributions. I pray that every family registered in our parish (525 families) will be active in financial donations to the OLBH Parish, even if these are only the scraps. Let us not forget however that in moments like this we need to remember especially the words of Jesus "Blessed are the poor in Spirit..."

May God Bless you in every way and may He continue the good work He has begun in every one of us. Fr. Andrzej

COLUMBIA: It can be easy to Eucharistic fall into a mindset in which Revival Mass is an obligation. If we could see "with the eyes of the angels," as you put it in your book, how would we approach Mass?

If we understood what is happening in the liturgy, our hearts would be longing to go to the most amazing event in the universe taking place right there my little parish church. We would realize this is where Jesus' loving sacrifice on Calvary is made mystically present. It is the number one place of encounter with our God, where we receive the very body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus.

The God of the universe wants to dwell inside of us — what an amazing gift of love. As we say in response to the invitation to holy Communion: "Lord, am not worthy.'





The move to legalize marijuana is really a move to commercialize marijuana for profit.

- We are moving way too fast to legalize in this country without taking into account the costs of such a policy. We need to slow down. The only people who benefit from a rush to legalize are a small number of investors.
- Today's marijuana is much more potent than in the past—with pot edibles, candies, cookies, ice creams, and waxes being up to 99% THC. Compare that to 5% Woodstock Weed.
- More minority kids are being arrested in Colorado for pot since legalization, and car crashes related to marijuana, young adult use, and workplace positives are skyrocketing in legal states. We do not need to legalize in order to reform the criminal justice system. We can remove criminal penalties, expunge records, and offer justice without commercializing today's highly pure THC pot products.
- The marijuana industry is seeing increased investment from existing giants of addiction. Altria, the parent company of Phillip Morris, recently invested more than \$2 billion into the industry, and has secured a minority ownership into Juul—the vaping giant—in a move to cement future stakes in the industry.
