Dear Friends in Christ,

Some time ago, I was coming back from Hot Springs, it was early evening and the sun was setting down to the west. I looked into the sky and saw some dark clouds, but suddenly as I passed the hills on the horizon, I saw another cloud. This one was as if almost set aside from the rest. It was covering the setting sun, which in turn illuminated the cloud. It was a spectacular view. The vibrancy of the sun was just beyond words, and the water particles in the cloud created a platform for all the colors to come alive. Like with every sunsetting, this experience was short lived, but not in my heart and mind. I will cherish this moment for a long time. These few scraps from God's home are enough to illuminate may days for a while.

This past week, the Church remembered a few important events, where many are being uplifted and nurtured by God's grace. On August 09, we remembered St. Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) and on August 14 was the feast day of St. Maximilian Kolbe. Both of these saints were imprisoned and died in the Nazi-Germany concentration camp, in Auschwitz. They were dismissed as nothing by their torturers, and yet they took the scraps from God's table and made them a source of life for many.

On Tuesday, we celebrated the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. What do they have in common? The answer is: the life of Jesus in their hearts and the chaos of the world in their lives. St. Maximilian and St. Benedicta found themselves in the midst of the chaos of war. Thy died in the concentration camp, but they did not lose the source of their peace. Always faithful to Christ, they were able and still are giving us direction to the truth. Blessed Mother had her life turned upside down at the Annunciation, but as she said Yes to the Lord, she became the source of inspiration. Her life, full of unknown became the foundation of faith, that God can only provide. And so, it is with us when we realize that things have not been the way we wanted. But in those moments, the grace of God shines, as we find our way to the Father, as we find our way to truth, just like the Canaanite women from today's Gospel. Not always we have what we want, but always we have what we need. For out of chaos this world was created, and it is in chaos that we often find new ways we can blossom. Be not afraid as you entrust your life to God, who is the Life and the Truth and the Way.




