Who do **they** say that I am? – It is an important question but not the most important, it's only a preliminary question. The real question is “Who do **you** say that I am?” The first question is easily answered – one has only to be **a reporter, one who relates the story of others**. But the second question is a searching one and only a disciple – the one who lives and is part of the story - can come anywhere within range of an answer.

Who do you say that I am? We respond to this question every time when we recite the Creed at Mass giving the Church's answer – you are the Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God true God, begotten, not made...

However, the problem here is this – **the mere repetition of a right answer is not the answer**. You probably found that out in primary school when you realized that the right answer given at the end of the arithmetic book was useless unless we reached it by valid steps ourselves. So, we've got the right answer, but do we try to get it on our own, do we try really experiencing it. Do we just repeat the Creed without really professing it? Do we recite this set of intellectual conclusions, without really re-committing and renewing our faith and ourselves? Another story is - Do we say, “You are the Lord” and then we leave this place and go back to work, home, our business and we act as if “He wasn't the Lord?”

Who do you say that I am? What does your life say that I am? What do your relationships with others say that I am? A year ago, we begun celebrating the Year of the Eucharist Renewal, growing in deeper understanding of the Mass. We have been growing since more and more into keeping Jesus and faith in our hearts. Many of us since been growing deeper into our relationship with Jesus, discovering our faith in new ways, and enjoying the newfound ways of understanding and inviting God into our lives. The message of this weekend continues that challenge. The answers may not be easy and sometimes maybe even be embarrassing, because we are sinners. But if we were not, if we believed that we can be saints and holy, what would our answer be?

Pray then, receive sacraments, practice virtues and you will encounter the Lord and you will not repeat after the Church with your lips only, but you will profess with the Church with your heart and deeds that Christ is the Lord.

Want to deepen your prayer life? Grow in conversation with the Lord?

COR AD COR *may be for you.*

The Cor ad Cor Spirituality Year is a weekly small group gathering of all men or all women to learn more about the spiritual life, to grow in relationship and conversation with the Lord, and to share faith and the work of the Lord with others.

The title, “Cor ad Cor,” is a shortened version of “Cor ad Cor Loquitur,” a Latin phrase meaning “Heart speaks to Heart,” which comes from a letter written by St. Francis de Sales to one of his spiritual directees. Later, St. John Henry Newman took it as his motto. The Cor ad Cor Spirituality Year is named because this retreat is about listening to the Lord from his heart to ours.

Cor ad Cor begins with the Oremus program from Ascension Press (8 weeks), and then moves into the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola according to the 19th annotation (additional 22 weeks). Small groups of about six people meet weekly with a trained leader for 30 weeks. In the Oremus program, Fr. Mark Toups teaches the basics of prayer and spiritual life and gives direction for prayer and journaling. Small groups gather each week to learn and to talk about the life of prayer and what the Lord is doing in them. As Cor ad Cor continues with the Spiritual Exercises according to the 19th annotation, group members follow the direction for daily prayer given by St. Ignatius and come to the group to continue to discuss the spiritual life and to learn more about the Rules of Discernment of St. Ignatius.
