Where is God in this world? That might be a question we are asking with all that is going on in the world, in our country, even all around us. We hear about the war in Ukraine, not nearly as often as in the past, but still virtually daily in the news. There are things going on in this country we struggle to understand, where we are pushed to see good things as bad and bad things as good. And even in our diocese, our parish, our families, where so many are struggling.

In this Sunday's gospel readings from Matthew 13, we hear Jesus tell the parable about the wheat and the weeds. In the *Word on Fire Bible – The Gospels*, Bishop Barron writes the following.

"God sows his good seed, his word, his love and compassion, but his project is met with opposition. Thus, Jesus told the parable of the wheat and the weeds, which indicates that evil always insinuates itself into the very fabric of the good. ... evil is always and everywhere parasitic on the good. Just as a parasite is living off of the healthy body (and thereby weakening it), so moral evil lives off of the good soul, the good society, the good Church (and thereby weakens them).

What is the result? That it is exceptionally difficult to extricate the evil from the good without damaging the good. To be sure, there are certain evils that simply have to be addressed – right now, no questions, no hesitations. But there are other evils (and they really are evil) that are best left alone for the time being, lest more damage is done in the process of extricating them."

So, ask yourself, what are the evils God is asking me to stand up and fight right now? And which evils, if we fight them, will cause more damage in trying to extract them? This is not an exercise we do on our own, we need to spend time in prayer, asking God what He wants us to do, and then do it. If we rely only on ourselves, we will have little courage or we will decide poorly. But with God's help, not only will we choose correctly, but He will help us, because He cares for all of us.

Follow up on the novena: Last weekend, we were asked to pray a novena of the Intercessory Prayer to Nicholas Black Elk for both Fr. Andrzej and Bishop Peter July 17-25, for their healing from cancer. Novenas (based on the Latin word for nine, novem) are prayed for nine days, usually to ask God for a special prayer request. But you can, and I also encourage you, to continue praying this prayer daily until they are healed.
