Traditionally, these words were sung or chanted at the beginning of Mass, on the 3rd Sunday of Advent which is known as Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is Latin for Rejoice and we are joyful today because we are just over a week away from Christmas. We find ourselves busily or frantically making our final preparations to celebrate the arrival of the Christ child into our midst. The church joins in this eager anticipation by counting down these days in a special way through the recitation of the "O" Antiphons. These antiphons also known as the Great Antiphons are used with the Magnificat during the evening prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours from December 17–23. The antiphons are based on Isaiah's prophecies and reveal the different titles given to the Messiah.

- O Sapientia (O Wisdom) Isaiah 11:2-3; 28:29
- O Adonai (O Lord) Isaiah 11:4-5; 33:22
- O Radix Jesse (O Root of Jesse) Isaiah 1:1; 11:10
- O Clavis David (O Key of David) Isaiah 9:6; 22:22
- O Oriens (O Rising Sun) Isaiah 9:1
- O Rex Gentium (O King of the Nations) Isaiah 9:5; 2:4
- O Emmanuel (God with us) Isaiah 7:14

Since each antiphon is short, it can be helpful to take some time to read, ponder, and pray with them each day as a way to prepare the heart, mind, and soul for Christmas.

December 17 - O Sapientia: O Wisdom of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!

December 18 - O Adonai: O Leader of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!

December 19 - O Radix Jesse: O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay!

December 20 - O Clavis David: O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness!

December 21 - O Oriens: O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

December 22 - O Rex Gentium: O King of all nations and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!

December 23 - O Emmanuel: O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!

If one starts with the last title and takes the first letter of each Latin word - Emmanuel, Rex, Oriens, Clavis, Radix, Adonai, Sapientia - the Latin words Ero Cras are formed, meaning, Tomorrow, I will come. Therefore, the Lord Jesus, whose coming we have prepared for in Advent and whom we have addressed in these seven Messianic titles, now speaks to us, Tomorrow, I will come. So, the O Antiphons not only bring intensity to our Advent preparation, but bring it to a joyful conclusion. — Dcn. Phillip

Third Sunday of Advent

Is 61:1-2A, 10-11 | 1 Thes 5:16-24 | Jn 1:6-8, 19-28

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

"Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing." Such simple words from today's second reading. And yet it is not always easy to put them into practice. It is difficult to rejoice if we or people we love are hurting. It can be hard to pray when life is pulling us in a thousand different directions. But on this Gaudete Sunday, the Sunday of rejoicing, we are asked to focus on a truth that can make both rejoicing and praying easier: Jesus entered humanity in flesh and blood to save us from our sins. This truth means that even if we don't feel like there is much gladness or joy in our lives today, we can rejoice in the knowledge that we all have the chance to spend eternity in a place where pain, disappointment and suffering will be no more. With our eyes focused on that prize, praying can become a natural part of our days.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Sometimes, I can make everything so complicated. I want to create charts and checklists to ensure that I am doing everything just right. But St. Paul's words today make me realize that living well is really not that complicated. He writes: "Retain what is good. Refrain from every kind of evil." That's it! Of course, while this is not complicated, it does require us to make prayerful, faithful efforts toward this end - and it is an end for which God has given us his grace, the help of the Church, and the prayers of our brothers and sisters in Christ. This includes St. Paul, who prays for us, "May the God of peace make you perfectly holy and may you entirely, spirit, soul, and body, be preserved blameless for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ." This is what is good in these dark days of Advent: the light of Christ is coming into our world. The Gospel says that John the Baptist testified to this truth - to the light. We can too! Let us continue to pray, to rejoice and to give thanks for God's gifts, especially the gift of his Son.

SING Stars, keep the watch. When night is dim One more light the bowl shall brim, Shining beyond the frosty weather, Bright as sun and moon together. People, look east and sing today: Love, the star, is on the way.
