The Saturday Vigil Mass at 5 PM is livestreamed on the Our Lady of the Black Hills Facebook page and then posted on olbh.org.

"Here am I, Lord, I come to do your will."

The responsorial Psalm for this Sunday is from Psalm 40, "Here am I, Lord, I come to do your will." All the readings for this Sunday are about doing God's will. In order to do God's will, we need to be able to "hear" God tell us what is His will for us. "Hearing" God happens differently for all of us. When I talk about hearing, I'm not necessarily talking about physical hearing God's voice in our physical ears. It is more using our spiritual senses, hearing God with our spiritual ears, seeing what God is revealing to us with our spiritual eyes, how God can use our imagination to reveal things to us, or how God stirs up our spiritual feelings. While there are many different ways to "learn" how God communicates with you, one way is by praying with scripture, using these steps used at the Covenant School of Spiritual Direction.

How to pray with Scripture

- 1. **Settle in your place of prayer**, have your Bible open to the scripture passage or the story from the sheet for the day.
- 2. **Pray a short prayer** of praise and thanksgiving asking the Lord's help to do your part in the prayer.
- Compose yourself for prayer. This is done by placing yourself as vividly as possible in the presence of God (setting aside all else in order to devote the prayer time to God alone.) Then review the theme and the grace.
- 4. **Ask for the Grace.** You should begin every prayer period by asking for the grace. By "graces" we mean the gifts which we cannot obtain by our own efforts but which, if we seek them earnestly, we will surely receive from God when we are ready (rightly disposed to receive them.)
- 5. Read the Scripture passage or story assigned to the theme of the day. Be as receptive as you can. You might read it once completely and then a second time more slowly stopping when something touches you. Allow the mystery to speak to your heart. Let any moment of feeling or intuitive knowing have its way. Do not try to control it, but rather give yourself up to its working.
- 6. Ponder in the Heart, not in the head. The key method in the mental prayer is to avoid reasoning about the truths of faith but to dispose yourself instead to receive the impact of God's words and acts in the depths of your being that is, in your inmost heart. This is where the Holy Spirit loves to move our personal responses, our "felt-knowing". If you have not already learned how to do this, please ask your Spiritual Director to coach you in the skills involved.
- 7. **Dialogue.** At the conclusion of every exercise have brief conversations with the Lord, person to Person. This should be spontaneous, heartfelt, thankful, praising God and emerging concretely out of the prayer experience received. It may be directed to God the Father, Jesus, Mary or to any particular saint, as seems appropriate.
- 8. End with the Our Father.
- 9. **Journal.** Write down, in a few words, a description of the movements of your feelings during your prayer experience.


By developing a daily practice of spending time with God through scriptures, eventually you can learn how God communicates with you, and you can learn what is God's will for you. Will you respond, "Here am I Lord, I come to do your will."


