Dear Friends in Christ,

Two weeks ago, we were pondering the question "what is the will of God for us." Right away, we do not know the answer to this question, but with God's grace we can discover it. We do this through prayer and careful listening to God's whisper. Last weekend Deacon Greg, spoke beautifully on the vocation in our life and how we can discover it as we come to know God through the scripture. God chooses the weak to shame the powerful. The uneducated fisherman became the disciple of Christ. From simple disciples, later on they became leaders.
