Jubilation from John

In the midst of the festivities and joy-filled celebrations of the Christmas season—filled with bright lights, gaily decorated trees, and beautifully wrapped gifts—there is one place in the Osnes home that exudes peaceful calm and serene tranquility: a wooden creche sheltering figures of Mary and Joseph and the Christ child lying in a manger, surrounded by sheep and shepherds, with angels hovering above. However, our nativity scene would be incomplete without wise men and gifts and a star shining in the heavens. These figures and signs complete the Christmas story—they announce the birth of a king whose kingdom is not limited by borders and whose reign extends beyond his earthly life.

But on this Feast of Epiphany, I want to complete our nativity scenes with another image drawn directly from today's Gospel reading—an image too easily eclipsed by the splendor of the star and the grandeur of the treasures offered to the infant Jesus. Upon entering the house where the child was—before offering him their gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh—the magi first "prostrated themselves and did him homage" (Mt 2:11). These wise and wealthy men fell upon the dirt of a stable floor—and they adored a tiny baby lying in the humblest of surroundings.

Our nativity scenes seldom capture this overwhelming moment of adoration and exaltation that truly reveals the divine nature of the Holy Child to the world. Our figurines of the three kings often are still regally mounted on their camels, high above the filth of the stable floor. Or they are on a bended knee, eyes set upon a babe in Mary's arms, offering precious but pitiable gifts to the priceless gift of God.

The great masters of art—from Giotto in the thirteenth century to Rubens and Rembrandt in seventeenth—portrayed a very different picture of this moment of Epiphany. Almost without exception, the masters focused on the Adoration of the Magi—painting magnificently dressed men falling down before the Holy Child—eyes lowered as those who are not worthy to look upon the face of God—humbly and delicately kissing the feet of the newborn king like a lowly servant kissing the feet of his master.

During this Christmas season, how much time have you spent simply adoring the Christ child? With the giving and the receiving, the family gatherings and the worship services, the decorating and the undecorating, have you had the time to simply sit before your nativity scene and pay homage to the Reason for the Season?

It's not too late. At the Vatican, nativity scenes are never dismantled until the Presentation of the Lord. I encourage you follow the Roman tradition this year and leave your nativity scene in place until February 2. This tradition will give you another month to bow down before the babe in a manger and truly contemplate the great mystery of the Incarnation. Prayerful time spent in homage and adoration will reveal the depths of love that God has shown in the Christmas story. In turn, the love of God revealed in Jesus Christ—Emmanuel, God-with-us—will open your heart to more fully receive and respond to the priceless gift of His presence throughout the year.


