# "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."

(Mt 9:37-38)

#### **Jubilation from John**

Among a nomadic people wandering an arid wasteland, God planted a seed. By his almighty power and because of his boundless love, He led these chosen people out of slavery and into a promised homeland. He cultivated the seed in a narrow strip of land between the shores of the Mediterranean Sea and the Jordan River—barely the distance from here to Wall Drug—a promised land roughly bounded by the Sea of Galilee on the north and the Dead Sea to the south. With endless patience—through war and pestilence, insubordination and outright revolt—for centuries, God awaited the harvest...

Among twelve men of limited means, probably with meager educations and sometimes with questionable backgrounds, God planted a seed. His heart was moved with pity at the sight of the promise unfulfilled—the harvest stunted and strangled by sin—and he planted again. He took his finest seed—his only begotten Son, the seed of a new covenant—and sowed it among four fishermen, a tax collector, a half-dozen more without any notable vocations—and a traitor. In the fallow and poorly tended fields of the old covenant—the troubled and abandoned sheep of his chosen people—he saw the promise of a rich harvest. But indeed, the laborers were few...


From this seed crop of Apostles, the Gospel has been scattered and sown over the entire world. The Master of the Harvest called other laborers to the field —and the Apostles laid hands on them and instructed them and sent them to plant and harvest. Through the line of apostolic succession, the seed of the new covenant has been handed down from bishop to bishop for two millennia. These bishops have laid their hands upon others to assist them in the fields—priests to perpetuate the sacrifice of Christ in persona Christi and deacons to serve the Body of Christ with charity, at the altar and in the Word.

On Thursday, June 29, at the 5:30 Mass at the Cathedral, Bishop Muhich will continue this tradition of sending forth laborers for the harvest in the Diocese of Rapid City. He will lay hands upon seven men and ordain them to the Order of Deacons. Among them will be Mr. Phil Thompson from our parish, carrying on a heritage of diaconal ministry embodied by four other men who have been called from OLBH, starting with Dcn. Walt Wilson in 1981. This abundant harvest of permanent deacons from our parish never would have occurred without your encouragement and your prayers—they are the fruit of your labors. I strongly encourage you to attend the ordination on June 29 and prayerfully support Phil and his cohort as they receive the Sacrament of Holy Orders.

God has planted a seed in the hearts of seven men, and the harvest is at hand. However, I know personally that the harvest time is when the grain is most vulnerable to the fickle winds of doubt and the crushing hail of the oppressor. Therefore, I ask you to labor even more fervently on their behalf over the next couple weeks. Beginning June 20 and continuing for nine days, please pray daily the Novena for Diaconate Ordination found in this bulletin. May the words of Jesus to the seed crop of Apostles inspire you: "Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give" (Mt 10:8).


