The Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Wisdom: Comes from the Latin word, Sapentia, which is derived from the verb "to taste." In the Letter of James, we read that wisdom comes from above as a gift of the Holy Spirit that is infused into the soul. From this we can see that Christian wisdom is a tasting, or experiencing in an intimate way, the mind and nature of God, which is revealed to us through the Holy Spirit. Wisdom is the ability to judge correctly, to discern what is just, not only through human reason, but also in the light of God's will. True wisdom is bound up in understanding of the divine and revealed in the person of Jesus Christ. It allows us to know God and savor his presence, but only if we seek after his will.

Understanding: The gift of understanding allows us to penetrate more deeply into the divine mysteries and to reach the fullness of the Catholic faith. It is far more than just knowing about God. Through the Holy Spirit, this gift helps us to understand the events that occur in our own lives, seeing and judging them according to the life of Christ.

Council: The gift of counsel helps us to know what we should or should not do in every situation that demands a moral decision. This gift, through the Holy Spirit helps a person to find his\her way along the winding and confusing paths of life that helps to make decisions leading to holiness.

Fortitude: This gift, in a real way, strengthens us to see ourselves as soldiers for Christ, freely willing to stand up and defend our faith in Jesus Christ. This gift strengthens the will and resolve, allowing a follower of Christ to stand firm to his or her convictions as a child and disciple of God.

Knowledge: This gift gives the Christian the supernatural light to see that all creation, our good actions, and all the good that has been achieved in history comes from God and is directed toward him. It involves supernatural understanding and surpasses what we are capable of achieving by our own efforts. Its development is dependent on one's faithfulness and responding to grace. Through this gift, the Christian finds Christ not only in creation, but in every human encounter, event and activity.

Piety: This gift helps the Christian to live their life whereby everything, every part of their life, is oriented toward a relationship with God and that we are his children. We see and trust in God in everything around us. It has a great impact on how we treat and love others.

Fear of the Lord: This gift is bound up in the Christian understanding of a just God - a God who holds authority and dominion over the world. It is not a fear in the sense of being punished but is defined by a profound love and we are afraid to disappoint the God who loves us.

Pentecost Sunday

Acts 2: 1-11 | 1 Cor 12: 3b-7, 12-13 | Jn 20: 19-23



As a college student, I found myself sitting near the information desk during a layover at a German airport. This was in the days before mobile phones and Google Translate. I remember being so impressed that the two young women behind the desk were able to answer questions in so many languages without missing a beat. Whether it was Spanish, French, German or English, each traveler heard an answer in their own language. I often think that must have been what it was like for the travelers to Jerusalem during Pentecost. They were in an unfamiliar place and yet God spoke to them in a way they could understand. And the beautiful thing about the Pentecost story is that it is not just relating one single moment in time. Instead, it is the start of the Holy Spirit's ministry here on earth, and in our baptism, we, too, receive the same gift of the Holy Spirit. Confirmation completes the grace we receive at baptism, since we receive a "special strength of the Holy Spirit." (ccc 1285) We, too, are given the tools to go forth and speak to others even when we are afraid they may not understand. Let us remember St. Paul's words from the second reading: "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." And then let us go out and use those gifts for the greater glory of God.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The idea of evangelizing is uncomfortable for many people. Sure, it was fine for the disciples to go out and start talking to strangers, but us? No way. However, evangelization doesn't have to mean starting conversations on the street (although it can!). Instead, it might be making the sign of the cross before a meal in a restaurant, mentioning Mass when a co-worker asks what you did over the weekend, or displaying a crucifix in your home where visitors will see it. In these small ways, we can encourage others to open the door for God to "shine within these hearts of yours," as today's Gospel Sequence says.

PRAY St. Paul reminds us today that we are all "baptized into one body" and "we were all given to drink of one Spirit." In today's divisive world, it can be difficult to remember that. Let us pray for one another knowing that all Christians – even those who may annoy us – are joined together in the same body of Christ. Specifically, have as your at-the-ready prayer this week for all circumstances, the following: *Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.*
