The first part of September, I presided at a wedding at Terra Sancta, and I always ask couples their plan of how to keep their marriage alive. This couple spoke about the importance of keeping joy and laughter in their marriage. "We will keep this marriage alive by having fun with one another and keeping each other laughing. Laughter is the cure all of the soul and through this we can laugh through the good and the bad and know that God has a plan for us regardless of if we can see it or not."

I added my own suggestions of how to keep their marriage alive in my preaching. Being faithful to Sunday Eucharist, a habit of reading and sharing Scripture with one another, spending time and in adoration, entrust your hearts to Our Mother Mary, monthly date nights, and of course inviting the priest over for dinner. This line brought some joy and laughter to the assembly.

As a priest it is a gift and a treat to be invited over to a parishioner's house for a meal to enjoy conversation and prayer, and yes there is usually joy and laughter as part of the evening too. As a priest I cherish these moments of grace and blessings. Such evenings help to keep my priesthood alive.

I encourage you to continue to pray for the priests in the Diocese of Rapid City. The past week in the West River Catholic Newspaper came out. I wrote an article on Priest as shepherd, warrior and healer. As you prepare for Priesthood Sunday at Our Lady of the Black Hills take the time to read the article and listen to the homily by Bishop Barron that calls us to pray for our priests to become shepherds, warriors and healers of God's people.

This is the 20th year in which we have been celebrating priesthood Sunday. It started in 2003, with the USA Council of Serra International, whose mission is to foster and affirm vocations to the priesthood and vowed religious life. They felt there was a great need to honor and pray in a special way those who are called to be priests. I know that your prayers and support keep my priesthood alive.

Here are some ways to express your appreciation from Serra International:

- Give your priest a spiritual bouquet. You can write something like, "Father please accept this spiritual bouquet as a thank you for all you do for our parish. I will say the rosary once a month for one year for all of your special intentions."
- -Send him a note detailing a time when he helped you or had a positive impact on your life.
- -Send him a flowering plant or a small tree that he can plant. Let him know that as the tree grows and thrives, that's a reflection of how he's helping his parishioners grow in love for God.
- -Give him a biography of a popular priest, saint, or pope. (The Mustard Seed in Rapid City would have some great suggestions for you.)
- -Remember, priests are regular people with hobbies and interests outside the church. Get him something related to his interests, whether it's golf, traveling, cooking, or art. If you aren't sure try calling the parish office and speak to his office staff.
- -Make a gift basket of baked goods, chocolates, coffee and beverages, etc.




Jail Ministry Needs Postage Stamps

SOUTH DAKOTA'S EXTREME ABORTION AMENDMENT

In his apostolic exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium*, Pope Francis warns us about political efforts that threaten the lives of preborn children: "Among the vulnerable for whom the Church wishes to care with particular love and concern are unborn children, the most defenseless and innocent among us. Nowadays efforts are made to deny them their human dignity and to do with them whatever one pleases, taking their lives and passing laws preventing anyone from standing in the way of this." (Par. 213) We have a responsibility, as a community that cherishes all human life, to become informed on this proposal that threatens the lives of South Dakota's preborn children, and to educate our fellow citizens. 



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE


Today's readings should bring us great joy. They are a reminder that our Lord may have high standards, but he is also "generous in forgiving" and "near to all who call upon him." In the Gospel, we hear the parable of the laborers in the vineyard. Some work all day while others arrive at the last hour. However, all are paid the same. Similarly, we can all receive God's heavenly reward - whether we are faithful Catholics since birth or converts in our final hour. This parable may evoke mixed feelings for those who see themselves as the laborers who have toiled all day and wonder why their reward is not greater. But rather than making us jealous, this parable should make us rejoice: How wonderful that everyone has the opportunity for everlasting life with the Lord! And what great comfort to know that if we falter and lose our way, it is never too late to return to God.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Sometimes, knowing that we are the recipients of God's bountiful mercy, we can be tempted to lead a life focused mostly on worldly pleasures. To paraphrase St. Augustine: Make me holy Lord ... just not yet! Of course we know this isn't the right attitude or approach to life, but it's certainly tempting. Let's return to the message of the Gospel for a moment. Yes, the Lord is generous in giving all the workers the same wage. But perhaps equally as important is that we are called to be workers in the Lord's vineyard, and what an honor and privilege that is! Serving in the Lord's kingdom here on earth is not drudgery; it is life-giving and fills us with God's love and grace. Let us recall the words of St. Paul in today's Letter to the Philippians. Although he longs to "depart this life and be with Christ," he knows that staying here on earth means "fruitful labor for me." Let us also strive to keep our eyes on the Lord and labor in his field for as long as we are able.

PRAY The first reading from Isaiah reminds us that the Lord works in ways we can't understand: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord." Let us ask God this week for the fortitude to reorient our thoughts and ways to his will, not ours, so as to "conduct [ourselves] in a way worthy of the gospel of Christ."
