And he told them this parable: "There once was a person who had a fig tree planted in his orchard, and when he came in search of fruit on it but found none, he said to the gardener, 'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?'"

He said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future.

If not you can cut it down.'" (Luke 13:6-9)

Just imagine, you have been driving and not paying attention to the traffic and suddenly you see the flashing lights behind you. All you can suddenly think of is "what did I do, or how can I get myself out of consequence of my lack of attention? In either case we wait patiently for the law officer to visit with us. And what a relief it is when all we get is a visit and a reminder that we need to be more diligent and careful while driving. We can even think to ourselves that we are just lucky or clever. Or perhaps we can think for a moment of a faithful friend who is always by our side. The one that we do not always appreciate, or have time to visit with, the one who is always treating us as if we just done something awesome together. Not easy to find one like that. Not easy to remember a friend like that, and yet these are the ones that will stand up for us and with us when things go wrong, when we are about to be "cut down."

Lent is a beautiful time for us to rediscover our true friendships. Through prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we help to form our conscience and to clean our heart. In our spiritual practices, we are making more room for our true friend and benefactor. Yes, we make more room, not just making a room, but we make more room. Our true friend is already with us and in our life, we just need to be reminded of his importance. The Gospel speaks of the fig tree (me and you?) that does not bear fruit and it is about to be cut down. The gardener (Jesus), objects to the idea, as he knows and sees the potential. Listening to the Gospel, we may feel like the tree sometimes, but our true friend is by our side – Jesus Christ. Seeing in us the potential for improvements, for change, simply, he sees in us the face of God. Can we get lucky enough and produce the fruit? Yes. We can always produce the fruit, because of the hope and compassion of Christ.

Our Lenten journey invites us not only to look good for the time of visitation, but to be able to bear fruit – as we learn to discover it through our conscience. That is why it is important to look at Lenten practice not as a time of forty days, but as a new springtime in our friendship with God. As we reflect Christ in our Lenten journey, we prepare ourselves to bear fruit beyond Easter, thus becoming a fruit bearing trees in God's orchard. Be not discouraged if you are not doing the best, if you need to re-evaluate some of your Lenten practices, to form anew your conscience. Pray and invite the Gardener to stop by and help you. Maybe you need a little trimming (Sacrament of Reconciliation), maybe you need some nourishment (Eucharist and prayer). With time and patient care of Jesus (our gardener), we can produce fruit that will be pleasing to many.

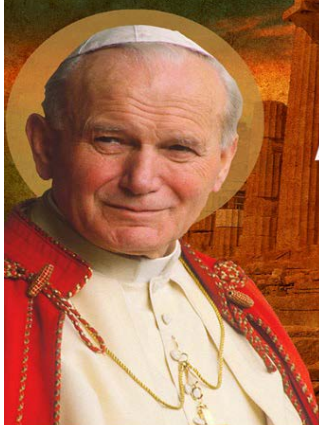
