Collect Prayer: O God, who through your Word reconcile the human race to yourself in a wonderful way, grant, we pray, that with prompt devotion and eager faith the Christian people may hasten toward the solemn celebrations to come. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen."

Rejoice, we are a halfway through the Lenten journey. Your challenge of making a room for God in your life through prayer, fasting and almsgiving (charitable works) is only a few weeks from being done. Before we know it, Easter will be here, and we will be celebrating the day of the Resurrection of the Lord. We will gather together in the Church, sing songs and say prayers OR WE MAY NOT. Never did I think that the celebration of Holy Week and of Easter would be under question. Never did I think of experiencing the Gospel call from Ash Wednesday of going into the desert in a literal sense. This is a beautiful opportunity to really and literally have the opportunity to enter into Prayer, Fasting and Charity. Charity is definitively put into practice.

Last week's rush to many stores, reminded me of post-Thanksgiving sales, only now we want to make sure we buy the necessities, not necessarily the bargain. The crowds and long lines put our patience and courtesy to the test. What a great opportunity to be charitable, and to be reminded of those who struggle on day to day basis. All this rush is caused by our realization that we lack things, material things, food and basic necessities. How many of us are so used to the idea of making a quick run to the store for a few items we need that day. Suddenly, we find ourselves asking, will there be what I need? That material fasting has turned also to the spiritual fast.

Honestly, I do not remember in all my seminary training that we would speak of cancelling Holy Week or Easter. That never was an option, and yet, here we are; masses and all church and Lenten events cancelled until further notice; spiritual fast and the experience of a desert. How can we go on without what we have been told is the heart of the Church and of our Faith? That is where we arrive to prayer. The Lord Jesus before his Passion went into the prayer. Like us, he too asked, how can this be? Maybe Father can take this away — maybe it is just a bad dream?

Our diocese is celebrating the Year of the Eucharist, we have spent many teaching moments focusing on the Mass, the meaning of different prayers, rituals and our responses. And when we were maybe tired of it, maybe looking for a reason not come to Church for Mass, when we thought, we are in charge – we found ourselves on the receiving end. Mass is cancelled, the Eucharist is not available – how good are we with prayer, haw many prayers do we know, how free and comfortable are the fathers to pray with their children, how open are the Mothers to speak to their kids about God and their own faith, are spouses ready to love and sacrifice for each other as they research and share their spirituality, are the kids wondering about God and their eternal salvation.

There are many reasons to say I do not need something, until suddenly that something might be taken away from us. With the present situation we have hope this shall pass, the responsorial psalm 23 reminds us that God is with us, even as we walk though the dark valley. Jesus also finds consolation in the love and support of his friends. But how hard it is sometimes to stay awake, even if for only an hour? I invite us all to look at this present time as a true Lenten journey with Christ and each other, as we walk into the desert, as we find ourselves weak and vulnerable, as we find ourselves hungry, thirsty and blind.

This is not a time to despair but to rejoice, not to worry about what we do not have but what the grace of God provides, not how imperfect we are, but what we have not discovered yet. Pray, fast and share your goodness. St. Joseph, Protector of the Church, Pray for us.



Communion – Sharing in the Eucharist is the high point of the entire celebration. Holy Communion seals the sacrificial nature of the meal in which we remember Christ's Passover. The Church teaches that the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian life.

Receiving Holy Communion is the most intimate moment of this encounter with the Lord Jesus. He gives himself to us completely, body, blood, soul and divinity; his totality. He can't give any more of himself to us. This is the most intimate union possible. There is no greater love. We respond to the invitation to receive communion as the Roman centurion did when Jesus offered to come to his home. We are "not worthy to have him enter under our roof." In order to enter this union, we, though sinners must open our hearts to this profound love for us. We are not receiving just a consecrated host; we are receiving Jesus himself, and therefore his saving, sacrificial love.

Many of the church functions have been cancelled, including Mass. This may give an idea that we do not need the donations - but we do. If at all possible, please continue your financial support. These dark times will pass and we want to be ready to serve you to the best of our abilities.
