Message from CCD Coordinator, Jennifer Doloski

"Confession is an act of honesty and courage – an act of entrusting ourselves, beyond sin, to the mercy of a loving and forgiving God." Pope Saint John Paul II.

On Sunday, March 17, our Second Grade students were introduced at Mass and blessed by Father Bo. We asked the congregation to pray for them as they prepare for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion.

One of my children was recently talking about the Sacrament of Reconciliation with a non-Catholic friend. She explained the basics of the sacrament and said that she first went in second grade. "You were HOW OLD?" Her friend was stunned. My daughter explained that second grade students had to go to confession in order to receive First Holy Communion. "How could seven-year-old you have something to confess?"

Admittedly, it can seem odd to someone on the outside that we Catholics are lining up our seven-and eight-year-olds to confess their sins. In a way, though, I think that is the point. Obviously, there is what Canon Law calls "the age of discretion," that is, a child who is old enough to distinguish right from wrong and make a proper confession. This, of course, can vary from one child to another, but, by and large, it is accepted that a seven-year-old child is capable of taking ownership of his/her actions. But I believe there is a certain brilliance to teaching a child to go to confession when his/her sins are of the variety of, "I cheated on my spelling test, I broke the television remote and blamed it on my brother, and I said I cleaned my room, but I really just shoved everything under the bed."

Think of weightlifting. No one who wants to become any kind of weightlifter walks into the gym and attempts to lift the heaviest weights. Proper form is often taught on a weight bench using only the bar. Once proper form is understood, weight can be added. Now, take it back to the confessional. Once a child has learned the proper form and necessity of making a good confession, then a sin of any weight can be confessed. And when we make a regular habit of going to confession and bringing our children to confession, too, it's not as hard for any of us to bring more significant sins into the conversation. In this way, we are constantly reassured of God's love and mercy.

So, how often should we go to confession? Canon Law 989 dictates that, "After having reached the age of discretion, each member of the faithful is obliged to confess faithfully his or her grave sins at least once a year." However, you might find it interesting, and even humbling, to learn that Pope Saint John Paul II and Saint Mother Teresa were among those whose habit was to go to confession once a week.

Please pray for our students who will, this month, experience the grace of God's mercy and forgiveness in the Sacrament of Confession. Pray, too, about whether it is time for you to approach the sacrament with a childlike trust. God will meet you there.
