Sacrament of the Sick: The Sacrament of the Sick (Anointing) is available after Mass and upon request.

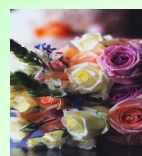
Communion brought to the Sick: Please call our Ministers to the Sick Coordinator.

In those countries, they have worked with the people to establish schools, clinics and many parish ministries. They are ministers of the Word who have seen the Word work great miracles among the lives of the people to whom they minister – and in themselves.

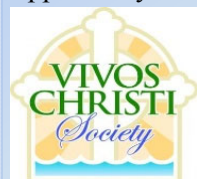

We are pleased to offer to the Parish an opportunity to dedicate one or more of these hymnals, "in honor of", or "in memory of" a loved one.

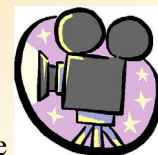

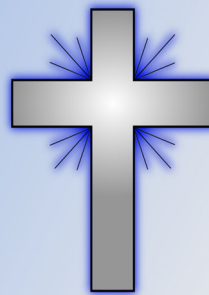
Our Mother of Mercy Outreach Services
