FROM THE PASTOR: We can learn some important things from the man mentioned in today's Gospel account by Luke. Simeon makes an interesting statement after he has held the infant Jesus in his arms, "Now, Master, You may let Your servant go in peace, according to Your Word." Simeon is making this statement to Yahweh (his master) while Joseph and Mary are present, having brought their new-born son to the Temple for the prescribed Rite of Presentation. "Peace"....something we all want and yet, very fleeting because it is often misunderstood. Listen to this story. A man always bought his shoes one size too small. The sales clerk wanted to know why, and the man explained. He said, "My house is a war zone. We are in constant conflict. I do not get along with my wife. My children do not get along with either one of us. And they fight among themselves like cats and dogs. When I get home in the evening, the only thing I can look forward to is taking off those shoes." Simeon can testify to us that there is a better way. He is a man described as "righteous and devout." He is not described as a man "without conflict in his life," and yet he tells God that He can "dismiss him in peace." Jesus taught this truth during his three years of ministry. Peace is not something that is defined as a life without conflict. After all, Jesus did say that He will be the cause of dissension among family members as well with other people in our small part of the world. Thus, Simeon teaches us that "peace" is the result of "keeping close to God by living His commandments," (righteous), and by a constant "prayer life," (devout). Just knowing that we are "right" with God can be a source of daily and lasting peace. Just knowing that we are trying our level and genuine best to always live by the Ten Commandments can give us peace of mind and heart. If we have any ability for personal shame in our lives, or have a working conscience in our lives, then we should feel guilt and remorse when not living by the Ten Commandments...all of them! But when we do practice the Ten Commandments faithfully, our Father in heaven promises us a "peace" that the world cannot give. And one way to ensure that we practice God's Ten Commandments is by daily praying to God for direction and strength to do so. All of us have read about or we personally know people who have plenty of money and worldly possessions but are unhappy, because of conflict in their marriages and family life, or are unhappy at work, etc., etc. It is safe to say that their wealth is not the cause of their turmoil and unhappiness. Rather, more than likely, it is because they are not "right with God" and "do not talk to Him in daily prayer." Simeon was a "righteous and devout man," according to the Word of God, and that is why he could say to his God, "I am ready to go in peace." -- Msgr. Greg


