Part of the Pastoral Plan of the Diocese of Jefferson City which Bishop McKnight wrote about recently in the **CATHOLIC MISSOURIAN**, was to set "local goals" in parishes. During much of 2019 and 2020 we conducted a process of gathering information from parishioners for the Parish Council to look at and see what kind of priorities need to be set for St. George Parish in the near future. The three priorities that surfaced and we would like to implement are: 1. Better tracking of and use of volunteers who offer to share their time and talent in various and different ways in the life of the Parish through Stewardship; 2. Looking into youth ministry for our high school members in the wake of the Confirmation program now returning to the grade school junior-high years...how can we continue to have them connected with St. George Parish during their high school years; 3. Continuing to support programs and activities which "reach out" to our larger community in areas of charitable need, being of service to struggling members of our communities. The Parish Council is looking for volunteers to help with number 2 above....youth ministry. We need adults who would be willing to form a committee and work on discerning current needs for ministry to youth, particularly in the area of spiritual needs, and to work with other members of the committee in this effort toward older youth ministry in the Parish.
