Being a Sponsor is a privilege! This religious commitment challenges the one so honored to be a responsible partner and a good example in mentoring the faith life of the person to be confirmed. The "life of faith" should include full, active and conscious participation in the regular worship of the church, reception of the Eucharist, and celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. If married, a sponsor's marriage should be in harmony with church laws. Sponsors should strive to be good examples of our Catholic Christian faith.

PLEASE NOTE: A SPONSOR MUST BE A PRACTICING CATHOLIC IN GOOD STANDING.

NON-PRACTICING CATHOLICS AND NON-CATHOLICS MAY NOT SERVE AS SPONSORS.

In accord with church law (canon 873 & 874) and in accepting responsibility, a sponsor must meet the following requirements:

- A sponsor assists the person who is to receive Baptism and/or Confirmation to lead a Christian life;
- There may be only one male and one female sponsor;
- A sponsor must be designated by the parents of an infant, by an adult himself or herself, or by the Pastor or other cleric who administers the Sacrament;
- A sponsor must have completed his or her 16th year of age;
- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist;
- A sponsor must be a practicing Catholic;
- A sponsor must be free of any canonical penalty;
- A mother or father may not be a sponsor for their child; and
- A baptized non-Catholic may only act as a witness where a Catholic sponsor has been designated.

The sponsor should also be available to attend required OCIA events and to guide the Catechumen / Candidate in living the life of faith. **Sponsors cannot be parents.**
