The history of San Antonio Catholic Church

The era of Spanish exploration of the southern coast of Florida began in the early 1500's. Following early explorations, Juan Ponce de Leon, Governor of Puerto Rico, was officially credited as having discovered Florida on Easter Sunday, 1513. He named this new land of lush vegetation Domingo de Pascua, the "Sunday of Flowers". In 1514, Spain appointed Ponce de Leon Governor of Florida. He sailed again to Florida with priests, farmers, artisans, soldiers and livestock to establish a permanent settlement.

Native to the area, the Calusa Indians dominated the west coast of Florida from the Keys to Sarasota. Living in thatched-roof huts built on large shell mounds, they were skilled artisans and savage warriors who lived off game, fish and shell fish. After arriving at Charlotte Harbor, Ponce de Leon was mortally wounded in a Calusa Indian attack. His vessel returned to Cuba where he died shortly thereafter.

It is believed that Hernando DeSoto camped near Ft. Myers and was in the area of Charlotte Harbor in May of 1539 in his quest to conquer this new land. It was not, however, until Pedro Menendez de Aviles, a Spanish naval commander, founded St. Augustine on Florida's east coast in 1565, that the first permanent settlement lying in the present day continental United States was established.

In 1566, Menendez launched a second colonial plan to seek an opening on the southwest gulf coast for what he hoped would be a cross-peninsula waterway. He established his base, *San Antonio*, in the greater Charlotte Harbor area where he hoped to begin peaceful colonization while he looked for a waterway to the Atlantic coast.

In 1567, a mission was established at the *San Antonio* settlement. Father Juan Rogel, a Spanish Jesuit priest, was placed in charge of the mission. He sought to establish good relations with the Calusa to bring them to an acceptance of Christianity and an abandonment



of their long rooted religious practices including human sacrifice. In 1573, both the base and the *Catholic Mission of San Antonio* were destroyed. It is believed by most historians that this destruction was again the work of the Calusa Indians.

The *Mission of San Antonio* in the Charlotte Harbor area was the first place where a Catholic presence was established that lies within the territory of the present Diocese of Venice in Florida. Mass was offered and the sacraments were celebrated. Because of its historical significance in the Diocese of Venice, Bishop John Nevins determined that should a new parish be established in this area, it would bear the name *San Antonio* and would continue the work of the church begun in 1565. *Our history is depicted in the stained glass window above the sanctuary.*

By 1991, Father Nicholas McLaughlin, Pastor of St. Charles' Borromeo Church in Port Charlotte, realized that the number of St. Charles parishioners exceeded the parish's ability to adequately service and care for them. With approval from Bishop Nevins, he began to look for an area which might ultimately separate from St. Charles and be the location of a new parish. To alleviate immediate over-crowding, Father McLaughlin celebrated Mass for the first time in the banquet room of Victoria Estates on Sunday, November 18, 1991, for the church community of Deep Creek. Four Hundred people were in attendance.

In anticipation of needing a new parish, the Diocese purchased ten acres of property on Rampart Boulevard which would be the site on which its facilities would be erected. On September 8, 1992, this church community was formally named the *Catholic Church Mission of St. Charles Borromeo Parish at Deep Creek*. Father Thomas J. Zedar was appointed the Mission's administrator. The *Catholic Mission at Deep Creek* had its first organizational meeting on October 29, 1992 at which Father McLaughlin introduced Father Zedar. People were invited to volunteer their services to the



Mission.


In order to permit more flexibility to serve the growing number of families in the Mission, three units were leased in the Deep Creek Commons Mall on Sandhill Boulevard. The spaces were renovated and prepared for the celebration of Mass as well as to serve the Mission as organizational, educational, social and office area. The location seated 300 with space for an additional 200 to stand at peak times.

Three hundred families formally registered as members of the Mission. That number steadily increased as more and more people became involved. There was great interest in establishing a parish. **On April 20, 1993, Bishop Nevins "erected" a parish in the Deep Creek area of Charlotte County. It was given the name of *San Antonio Catholic Parish*.** Father Zedar was named Founding Pastor.

Plans were begun to build our first facility, a provisional church. It would be a permanent building, well able to meet our needs for several years. However, as the Deep Creek and Charlotte Harbor areas continued to grow and develop, a larger, permanent church would be needed and the provisional church would ultimately become the parish center. We were wisely advised that our future perceived needs of growth to 3,000+ households could not be met with our current 10 acres. An additional 10 acres contiguous to our property was purchased in 1993.

Ground was broken for the provisional church on the **Feast of *San Antonio*** on June 13, 1994. As the official ground breakers left the ceremony, the bulldozers arrived. For the next several months, the site was prepared for our building. In keeping with our heritage, the architecture of our building is Mediterranean Revival. It is able to seat 500 people. As need dictates, additional space for 250 is available by opening up folding walls. Housing offices, classrooms, meeting rooms, social space and a kitchen, it provides adequate worship space as well as areas to carry out the many ministries, programs and activities for several years.

It is with a sense of achievement and thanksgiving that our new facility is formally dedicated on Sunday afternoon, October 15, 1995 at 2:00pm.


Lighting of the Altar and the Church

A brief history of Saint Anthony of Padua Priest and Doctor of the Church



St. Anthony of Padua, our Patron Saint, was born August 15, 1195, to young parents of Portuguese nobility. In Baptism, he received the name of Ferdinand.

For his early education, Ferdinand's parents placed him in the community of the Canons of the Cathedral of Lisbon. At 15, he entered the Order of Regular Canons of St. Augustine near Lisbon. Two years later, he was transferred to the priory of the Holy Cross of the same Order at Coimbra. By age 20, Ferdinand gave up all claim to his father's titles and estates and was ordained an Augustinian priest. He remained at Coimbra for eight years where he prayed and studied the Bible in obscurity.

In 1220, the relics of five Franciscan missionaries martyred in Morocco while accompanying the Crusades which were sent to his monastery. Ferdinand was inspired to follow in their footsteps of Faith. Against much opposition, he finally obtained consent and passed over to the Franciscan Order so that he might preach the gospel to the Moors. He was admitted in 1221 as Brother Anthony and was sent to Morocco. Unfortunately, Anthony soon became very ill. On his return to Spain, contrary winds drove his vessel to Sicily. Later that year while attending a general chapter of the Order in Assisi, Italy, he saw St. Francis.

Assigned to a hermitage of Sao Paolo near Forli, no one knew the sickly young friar had brilliant intellectual and spiritual gifts. At an ordination ceremony when no one was prepared to preach, Anthony was told to speak whatever the Holy Spirit should put in his mouth. His eloquence was thus discovered and he was commissioned to preach throughout northern Italy. Traveling through France, Spain and Italy, he often preached in marketplaces because churches could not hold the crowds who came to hear him.

Anthony was made a professor of theology, a subject which he later taught at Bologna, Toulouse, Montpellier and Padua. He was the first of his order appointed to teach theology, and was an envoy from the Franciscans to Pope Gregory IX who called him "the Ark of the Testament" for his knowledge of the scripture. During his lifetime, he was one of the most knowledgeable persons about the scriptures.

Many miracles were attributed to St. Anthony: his sermon to the fish at Rimini, the mule that knelt before the Blessed Sacrament, the Psalter that was stolen and returned (because of this he is best known as the patron of lost items), and the story of how his host saw him holding the Child Jesus in his arms when he looked through his window.

When he died on June 13, 1231, at the age of 36, people immediately called for his canonization which occurred within a year of his death. We know and revere him today as our Patron Saint, St. Anthony of Padua.

The great cathedrals of Christianity are a lasting tribute to the abiding devotion and personal love each Catholic has for God. Our new parish, San Antonio, is a symbol, not only of the flourishing Catholic presence in Port Charlotte, but also a sign of love and devotion for God in our own times. Through the sacrifice of our time, talent and treasure, we as founders of this new Provisional Church, San Antonio, have made it possible for ourselves and future generations to be strengthened and to grow in the love of God.


