

### **Our New Saints**

Carlos Acutis (1991-2006) is known for his deep faith and digital expertise. He used his computer-coding skills to draw attention to Eucharistic miracles around the world. His miracles' exhibit, featuring more than 100 documented miracles involving the Eucharist throughout history, has since traveled to thousands of parishes across five continents (Including the Cathedral in Owensboro).

Acutis called the Eucharist "my highway to heaven," and he did all in his power to make the real presence known.

He was an avid mountaineer and Third Order Dominican known for his charitable outreach. At 17, he joined the St. Vincent de Paul Society and dedicated much of his spare time to taking care of the poor, the homeless, and

the sick as well as demobilized servicemen returning from World War I. Frassati died of polio on July 4, 1925. His doctors later speculated that he had caught polio while serving the sick.

John Paul II, called him a "man of the eight beatitudes," describing him as "entirely immersed in the mystery of God and totally dedicated to the constant service of his neighbor."
