Steps to sainthood

Process of being declared a saint
by the Roman Catholic Church



Examination

- Typically, a candidate must be dead at least five years before review
- Local bishop put in charge of investigating candidate's life
- If deemed worthy, called "**Servant of God**"

Veneration

- If investigation shows candidate lived by heroic Christian virtues, earns title "venerable"

Beatification

- If it is proved that candidate is responsible for a posthumous miracle, candidate declared "blessed"; martyrs can be beatified without evidence of miracle

Canonization (sainthood)

- After proof of a second posthumous miracle, the pope will canonize the candidate
