Father Prince Raja Pastor

2nd Sunday of Advent December 4, 2022

The liturgy of today speaks of repentance, personal change of heart, a transformation or conversion. Repentance is more than merely grieving over our sins; it is a call to change for the better. Today's First Reading from the Book of Isaiah consists of a descriptive prophecy related to the coming of the ideal king from David's line. Today's Second Reading Paul reminds the Romans that the Old Testament calls for the people to be steadfast in their difficulties. It also provides encouragement. Here the Apostle tells the Romans that whatever was written in former days was written for their instruction, so that by steadfastness and by the encouragement of the scriptures they might have hope.

In today's Gospel, Matthew presents us John the Baptist as he introduces Jesus to the world. The church chooses him as the personification of the Advent theme he preaches repentance. as transformation of the heart and reform of our lives. He calls people to prepare the way for the Lord and make his paths straight. His words have an advice and warning for each one of us. In our Gospel today, repentance is tied to the baptism of John as the people actively sought conversion and were acknowledging their sins. John the Baptist claimed that his baptism would be that of water while the baptism of Jesus would be of the Holy Spirit.

In this holy season of Advent, as we prepare to welcome Christ at Christmas John the Baptist advices us to prepare the way of the Lord, by true repentance of our past failures and to have a firm resolution to straighten the ways of the Lord that is not to deviate from the true Christian way of life in the future. During Advent, we are called to be repentant of our sins. We are called to pray unceasingly, to make penance, and to perform acts of charity towards our brothers and sisters in Christ.

St. Felix Catholic School Eric Sonnek, Principal

On November 21st, St. Felix and St. Agnes Parish Councils, St. Felix Finance Council and Trustees along with the St. Felix School Advisory Board came together to discuss the future of the parishes and school. As principal of the school, I shared the vision of St. Felix Catholic School. The school shared a vision that would help carry out our mission; which is "We are a Catholic, Christ-centered school dedicated to lifelong learning where students are encouraged to develop spiritually, morally, academically and socially."

In looking at carrying out this mission, we discussed the possibility of expanding our school. Within the next year or two, we are looking to start expanding by adding 7th and 8th grades. We would start by adding one grade each year. Our school community is in support of this; during the most challenging times in a child's life giving them a foundation to help make solid moral choices in a Christ-Centered environment. In addition our thoughts are to possibly expand to add child care, adding a gathering space at the church, and merging our school and parish offices to maximize resources.

We will be putting together a steering committee to help discuss the other areas of expansion for the parish and school. They will be working with the Diocese of Winona-Rochester, the Catholic School Center of Excellence, and a consultant who helped with Catholic Schools expand in the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis. As we continue to move forward with this expansion we will continue to keep you all informed of the process.

This is an exciting time for our parishes and school. We look forward to working together to see our parishes and school grow by keeping Christ at the center of what we are doing and to help support each other on this faith journey. Please pray for us as we continue to move forward.

Every year, it seems that December 31 arrives more quickly than we imagine it will. With the end of the year comes a rush to ensure charitable donations are made in time to qualify as deductions for the current tax year. Here are some things to keep in mind when making your year-end contributions to nonprofit organizations:

CONTRIBUTIONS BY CHECK

For most contributions made by check, the mailbox rule applies. When a donor uses the United States Postal Service, the IRS considers the date of the postmark to be the delivery date for the contribution. Donors are encouraged to request a receipt from USPS when they send the donation; for this reason, sending by certified mail is a good idea.

Note: The IRS has not extended the mailbox rule to include private carriers in the context of charitable giving, so it's best to avoid using UPS or FedEx for vearend contributions.

CONTRIBUTIONS MADE IN PERSON

For contributions delivered to a nonprofit organization by hand, the contribution date is that of the in-person transfer. Again, it's wise to request a receipt.

CONTRIBUTIONS OF CASH AND SECURITIES

Contributions of cash and securities may be made through electronic transfers from the donor's account to the nonprofit's account. Contributions made through account transfers are deductible not when the transfer is directed by the donor but on the date when the assets arrive in the nonprofit t's account.

While account-to-account transfers of cash often occur on the same or next business day, electronic transfers of securities can take a few days to clear. For this reason, electronic stock transfers should be initiated at least five business days prior to the end of the year.

A SPECIAL NOTE REGARDING MUTUAL FUNDS

Some mutual funds are not able to be transferred by depository trust corporations (DTC). Instead, these mutual funds are transferred by a change recorded on the issuer's books and records. This can take weeks to occur. It's best to begin this process as soon as possible, to ensure a 2022 deduction.

CREDIT CARDS AND OTHER ELECTRONIC PLATFORMS

A donor who makes a contribution via a credit card or through an electronic platform that facilitates credit card transactions may claim the deduction as of the date the card was charged.

IRA ROLLOVER CONTRIBUTIONS

IRA rollover contributions must be made no later than December 31, 2022, to count toward a required minimum distribution (RMD). An IRA rollover contribution is considered to be made when the distribution from the IRA is received by the charitable organization. Please initiate electronic or check transfers from your IRA account early to ensure the funds arrive well in advance of December 31, 2022.

If you have check-writing privileges on your IRA, the normal postmark date rule does not apply. The funds must actually leave the custodial account by December 31, 2022, for the distribution to count against your RMD for that calendar year.


