**Father Frerichs**  
**Weekly Column**

This is a week filled with significant feasts. With today's celebration of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ, the Church invites us to hold the sacrament of the Eucharist in highest regard. Jesus' teaching that he nourishes us with his body and blood is explicit in today's Gospel. Although many people left him on account of this teaching, Our Lord was not able to withdraw anything of what he said.

The Feast of Corpus Christi originated in 1246 when Robert de Torote, the bishop of Liege, ordered special feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament in his diocese. This devotion quickly began to spread as a result of many laypersons and clergy. There have also been many eucharistic miracles throughout the ages, wherein the Eucharistic host would either begin to bleed or partially turn to flesh during the Mass. Pope Urban VI instituted the Feast to the Universal Church in August of 1264.

Friday, June 19th, is the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Although devotion to the Sacred Heart goes back to the 11th century, attention to this devotion significantly increased when St. Margaret Mary Alacoque had multiple visions of the Sacred Heart between 1673 and 1675. Unlike most feasts, the date of this feast will change annually. It is celebrated on the Friday after the octave (eighth day) of the feast of Corpus Christi. Corpus Christi, which is traditionally the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. This is a wonderful feast day to research with one's children and grandchildren.

And last, but certainly not least, is the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This feast is always celebrated the day following the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart. The heart of a person represents the core of who we are, what we value, our character. Like Mary, may our hearts always be united as closely with that of the Sacred Heart, who continues to pour himself out for us each and every day!

### Word of the 'Living Father': Scott Hahn Reflects on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

The Eucharist is given to us as a challenge and a promise. That's how Jesus presents it in today's Gospel.

He doesn't make it easy for those who hear Him. They are repulsed and offended at His words. Even when they begin to quarrel, He

insists on describing the eating and drinking of His flesh and blood in starkly literal terms.

Four times in today's reading, Jesus uses a Greek word—trogein—that refers to a crude kind of eating, almost a gnawing or chewing (see John 6:54, 56, 57, 58).

He is testing their faith in His Word, as today's First Reading describes God testing Israel in the desert.

The heavenly manna was not given to satisfy the

Israelites' hunger, as Moses explains. It was given to show them that man does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.

In today's Psalm, too, we see a connection between God's Word and the bread of life. We sing of God filling us with "finest wheat" and proclaiming his Word to the world.

In Jesus, "the living Father" has given us His Word come down from heaven, made flesh for the life of the world.

Yet as the Israelites grumbled in the desert, many in today's Gospel cannot accept that Word. Even many of Jesus' own followers abandon Him after this discourse (see John 6:66). But His words are Spirit and life, the words of eternal life (see John 6:63, 67).

In the Eucharist we are made one flesh with Christ. We have His life in us and have our life because of Him. This is what Paul means in today's Epistle when He calls the Eucharist a "participation" in Christ's body and blood. We become in this sacrament partakers of the divine nature (see 1 Peter 2:4).

This is the mystery of the faith that Jesus asks us to believe. And He gives us His promise: that sharing in His flesh and blood that was raised from the dead, we too will be raised up on the last day.

*It goes well for the man who deals generously and lends, who conducts his affairs with justice. He will never be moved; forever shall the just be remembered. ~ Psalm 112*
