**Father Frerichs
Weekly Column**

Having transitioned through the seasons of Lent and Easter, we are well into the months of summer. The liturgical color of green signifies that we are now celebrating the season of ordinary time. Why do we call this part of the church year “ordinary time” and what is its meaning?

While we might be tempted to think of ordinary time as an “uninteresting” or even “mundane” part of the Church year, nothing could be further from the truth. The word “ordinary” is taken from the root word ordinal, which simply means “counted time.” The purpose of this season is to move us through those aspects of the liturgical year that stand outside of the birth, death and resurrection of our Lord. The dark green color we commonly see symbolizes both life and growth. Where do we discover this new life and growth? It is found in the various mysteries we celebrate throughout this season. One example of this was the recent celebration of the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The Sacred Heart of Jesus is an important dimension of our faith that helps us appreciate Jesus love for us, fully revealed in his suffering and death on the cross. Last week we celebrated the Nativity of John the Baptist and the Feast of the Saint Thomas More. Feast days are commonly celebrated on the death of a saint. The saints of the Church offer powerful examples of faith and virtue; they assist us with their prayers and invite us to know them better.

With the return of this season of ordinary time comes an invitation to reflect more deeply upon many aspects of our faith that are not directly tied to the birth and death of Jesus. This season is not a period of rest from other “more important” times of the year, nor should it be ordinary in any sense of the word; all that we need to do is open our hearts to the readings, the various feast days placed before us and the many spiritual blessings that God has to offer through the life and ministry of His Church. By doing these simple things we will be opening our own hearts to receive the many gifts God has prepared for

Also we would like to thank John Miller for his years of service as the caretaker of St. Agnes Church and Hall since 2010.



Feast Day of St. Junipero Serra

Serrans are Catholic lay men and women who vigorously respond to the call to promote and support vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life in the Catholic Church. Today, Serra's global influence is made strong by over 20,000 members who work to create a "culture of vocations".



We will celebrate the Feast Day of our Patron St. Junipero Serra on July 1. He was the first Saint to be canonized on US soil by Pope Francis in 2015. He was an 18th Century Franciscan Friar who left his home in Spain to found 21 missions between 1769 and 1782 that would become the major cities of California: San Diego, San Francisco, Santa Barbara and Santa Clara. Noted by St. John Paul II, "He was destined to be the Apostle of California." Despite major health issues he persevered and converted over 5300 individuals to Christianity. His motto, "Always Go Forward" has become the Serra motto; to stay focused on our mission of promoting and supporting vocations.



We will celebrate his Feast Day on Wednesday, July 1, with 9:00 am Mass at St. Mary of the Lake Church, Lake City, with fellowship to follow. Please join us as we celebrate this man of great faith and zeal.

To Find Our Lives: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Liturgy this week continues to instruct us in the elements of discipleship. We're told that even the most humble among us have a share in the mission Christ gives to His Church.

We're not all called to the ministry of the

Apostles, or to be prophets like Elisha in today's First Reading. But each of us is called to a holy life (see 2 Timothy 1:9; 1 Thessalonians 4:3).

At Baptism our lives were joined forever to the cross of Christ, as Paul tells us in today's Epistle. Baptized into His death, we're to renounce sin and live for God in Christ Jesus.

We are to follow Him, each of us taking up our personal cross, as Jesus says in today's Gospel. That

doesn't mean we will all be asked to suffer a martyr's death. But each of us is called to self-denial, to the offering of our lives in service of God's plan.

Jesus must be elevated to first place in our lives—above even our closest bonds of kinship and love. By Baptism, we've been made part of a new family—the kingdom of God, the Church. We are to proclaim that kingdom with our lives, bringing our fathers and mothers, and all men and women, to live as “little ones” under the fatherhood of God and the kingship of the Holy One.

We do this by opening our hearts and homes to the service of the Lord, following the Shunnamite woman's example in today's First Reading. As Jesus tells us, we're to receive others—not only prophets but also little children, the poor, and the imprisoned—as we receive Christ Himself (see Matthew 18:5; 25:31–46).

As we sing in today's Psalm, we are to testify to His favors and kindness in our lives.

We're to hold fast to the promise—that if we have died with Christ, we shall also live, that if we lose our lives for His sake, we shall find our reward, and walk forever in His countenance.

It goes well for the man who deals generously and lends, who conducts his affairs with justice. He will never be moved; forever shall the just be remembered. ~ Psalm 112
