Valentine's Day Fun For REACH

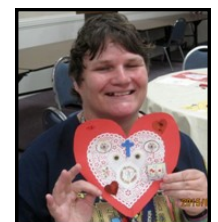
REACH stands for “Religious Education and Activities for the Community Handicapped”.
