White has been the associate superintendent of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee's Office for Schools for the past nine years. Her work has significantly supported principals throughout the 10 counties of the archdiocese through increased professional development opportunities and collaborative efforts at the leadership level. Before joining the archdiocese, White held principal positions at St. Margaret Mary in Milwaukee, Holy Apostles in New Berlin and St. Albert School in Milwaukee.
