LONG LIVE CHRIST THE KING

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JASON – I can already smell Turkey. Thanksgiving week always conjures up excitement and eagerness for me. Of course, as you may subtly know, Thanksgiving means that we are one more holiday closer to Christmas; but more than that, this week and today put into perspective what I am thankful for as this weekend, the holidays, and our very life are about gratitude for all that has been given to us. It is Jesus' assurance that he has come to allow us to take part in the Kingdom of God in this weekend's gospel that compels us to be grateful. Even amidst challenges, suffering, and drudgery of what our lives can be; when we remember and realize we have Jesus as King that helps us put into perspective everything else. The Solemnity that we celebrate in "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe" also reminds us to be grateful that we have been saved not by ourselves or our ways; but by one who gave everything and will give everything. Below is a history of this feast that I think helps us understand it and its indirect connection to Thanksgiving:

"On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King.

Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical Quas primas ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

During the early twentieth century, in Mexico, Russia, and some parts of Europe, militantly secularistic regimes threatened not just the Catholic Church and its faithful but civilization itself. Pope Pius XI's encyclical gave Catholics hope and—while governments around them crumbled—the assurance that Christ the King shall reign forever. Jesus Christ "is very truth, and it is from him that truth must be obediently received by all mankind" (Quas primas, 7).

Christ's kingship is rooted in the Church's teaching on the Incarnation. Jesus is fully God and fully man. He is both the divine Lord and the man who suffered and died on the Cross. One person of the Trinity unites himself to human nature and reigns over all creation as the Incarnate Son of God. "From this it follows not only that Christ is to be adored by angels and men, but that to him as man angels and men are subject and must recognize his empire; by reason of the hypostatic union Christ has power over all creatures" (Quas primas, 13).

The Church calls us to acknowledge Christ's kingship with our whole lives:

He must reign in our minds, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. He must reign in our wills, which should obey the laws and precepts of God. He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things, and cleave to him alone. He must reign in our bodies and in our members, which should serve as instruments for the interior sanctification of our souls, or to use the words of the Apostle Paul, 'as instruments of justice unto God.' -Quas primas, 33

I don't know about you, but this explanation both fits our time and helps us to truly give thanks for the gifts we have been given, especially the gift of the Eucharist as our King's presence meets us where we are (hence why we had Eucharistic Adoration this weekend). Please take time this week to

pause, remember, and give thanks for Christ our King!



Speaking of Thanksgiving, please join us for our Thanksgiving Mass. This year you have two opportunities: Wednesday, November 26 at 6pm or Thursday, November 27 at 7:30am. I know these times may be odd to us, but they were chosen to allow those traveling and those who will be preparing dinner to hopefully attend to start your holiday off in the most important way we can. Please join me! Also, I am looking forward to working with you at our Dinner on Thursday. Please know there are still plenty of ways to get involved in our Thanksgiving Dinner here at the parish. Please visit our website for up-to-date information and to sign up for any of the remaining shifts/help needed.

Next weekend, remember to bring your Advent Wreath to be blessed. Thank you to the Catholic Daughters of America for offering them to be purchased after masses through next weekend as well!

We are certainly entering a very busy time of year. Please make sure the office has your up-to-date email (as well as phone, address, etc.) so you can receive the latest up to date information. Also, if you have not done so, make sure you download myparish app so you can receive various reminders.
