

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JASON – new (Liturgical) Year and Thanksgiving weekend to you! "Come, Lord Jesus" is followed by "The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all the saints. Amen". These are the last words found in Scripture at the end of the Book of They help us understand our calling as Christians is to do two things: 1) Become Saints and 2) Prepare for his coming. We cannot have one without the other. All of the month of November has been reminding us that holiness is achievable in our lives by how God calls us. We began by remembering all of the Saints, then all of the faithful departed on their way to becoming saints, and then also remembering we are called to live that ability through our relationship of God through Prayer. Hence preparing for his coming is by living to the best of our abilities to do his will today. The Season of Advent is actually determined by where a feast of a Saint (Andrew) falls on the Calendar. The season begins on the Sunday closest to his feast day (November 30). Andrew was the one who brought Peter to Jesus. He is a great reminder of how we are called to spend this and the Christmas Season: Come to Jesus to bring others to him! That is why we begin our Advent with the final words of Scripture because we have to be reminded that his Grace is with us. This season always begins with a "future focused" as we remember the "Advent" (meaning coming) of Christ at our personal end (earthly death) and the worldly end (end of the world). That is also why the color of Advent is purple to remind us to be focused on the future by repenting today.

Even though the beginning of Advent is "future focused", it marks the beginning of the new Church Year. During this year, we will hear from the Gospel account of Matthew that reminds us that Jesus will call/calls us by name, as the name signifies the dignity that we have been given. Take time at the beginning of this Advent journey to begin anew, remember his grace, take time to slow down and pray, enjoy the beauty of this Season, open your heart to the corporal works of mercy, and spend time grateful for all of the gifts we have been given. Please see the schedule that was mailed (and emailed to you) outlining our Advent/ Christmas journey together. But please remember that both the schedule and our bulletins were published days/weeks in advance. If there is a schedule change it will be communicated on our website, email, or myparishapp. Again:

- 1. If you have not been receiving emails or mailings, let the office know.
- 2. If you have not been receiving the myparishapp updates, check your settings to make sure the "push notifications" are on or download the app. The instructions remain on our website and bulletin.

Please don't forget to stop by and have your car blessed tomorrow/today (Sunday) after Mass at the Main Entrance of the Church. As the Holiday Season begins and we find ourselves traveling, this is a great time to remember that the lord gives us all good gifts (including our cars) and we call the protection of his mercy on ourselves and our passengers as we go over the river and through the woods. Aside from this, we also have #iGiveCatholic coming up on Tuesday (see information further in the bulletin), First Friday

Adoration, and our Parish Feast Day next Monday, December 8!




