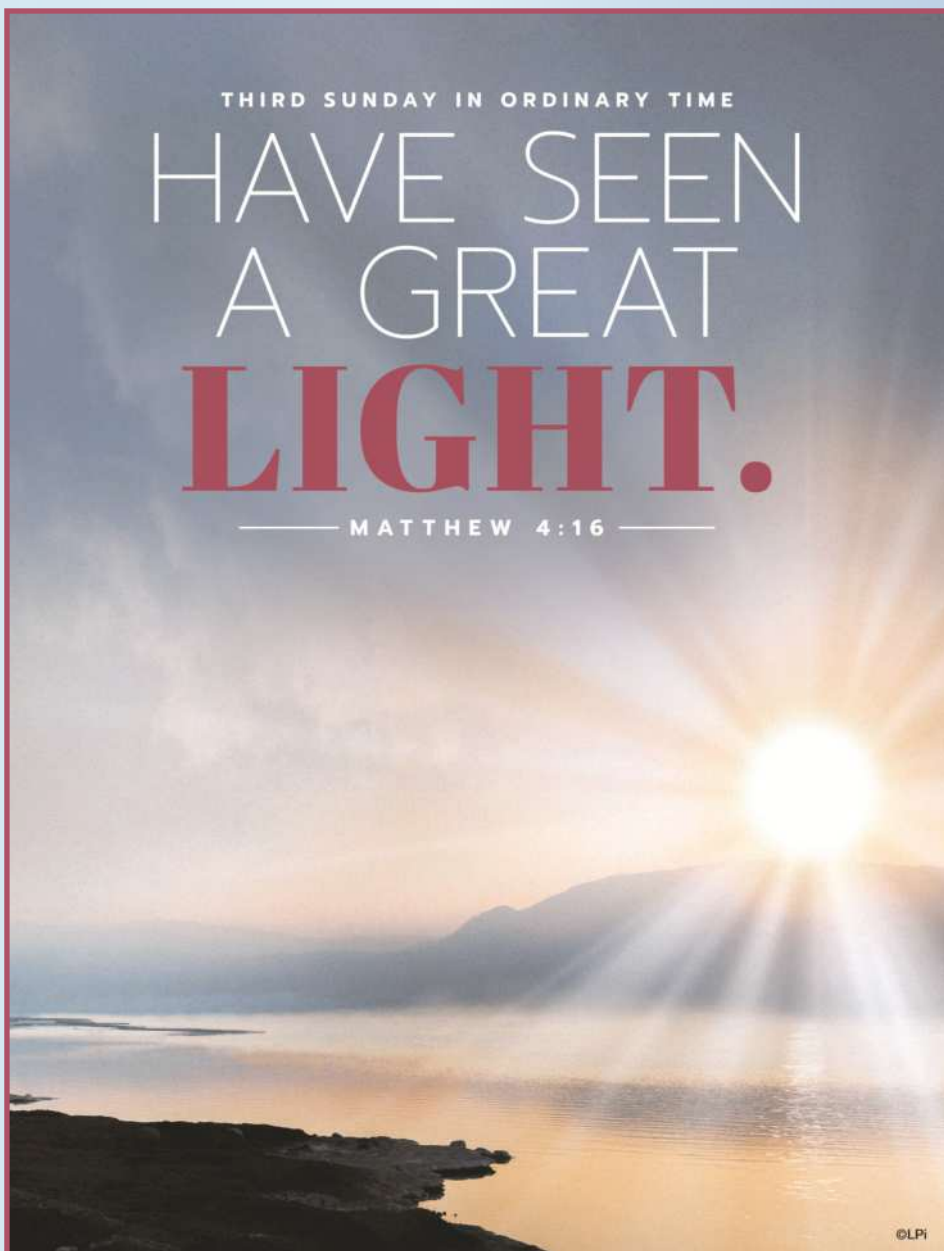
Parish Membership

There are times I wish I had no obligations. It would be great to take my wife's hand, hop in the car, and drive into the sunset. Where we were going would not matter as much as the fact that we would have nowhere we *had* to be. There would be nothing we *had* to do. No bills. No commitments. No problems. *Freedom!*

Sunday of the Word of God**

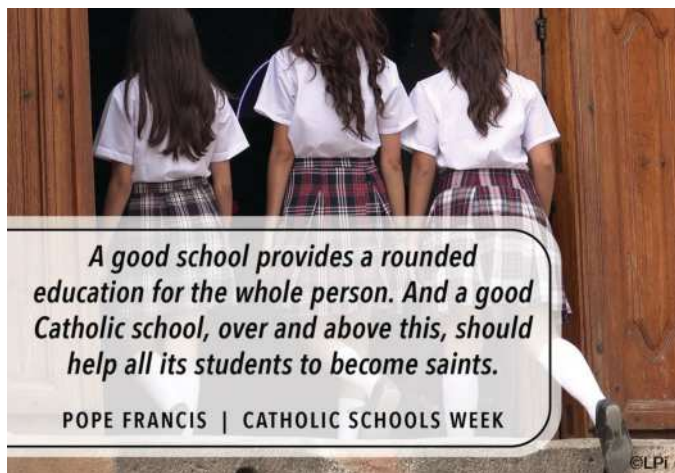

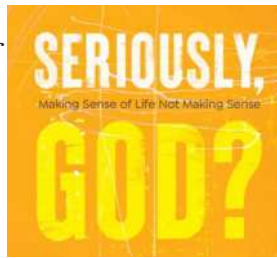

ANSWER TO "QUESTIONS MOST CATHOLICS CAN'T ANSWER"

- Correct, because the Eastern Orthodox Churches have the seven sacraments and therefore a real priesthood. It takes a real priest to consecrate the Real Presence.
- Wrong, because a priest may celebrate Mass by himself. The validity of the Mass does not depend on the presence of witnesses. Perhaps you are confusing here the validity of a marriage, which normally requires two witnesses.
- Wrong, because Anglican orders are not valid. Out of courtesy we call Anglican ministers "Father", but Pope Leo XIII definitely determined in 1896 that Anglican orders long ago became defective. In *Apostolicae Curiae* he said that Anglican ordinations are "absolutely null and utterly void". The logical conclusion is that Anglican priests are, technically, Christian laymen. Since they aren't actually priests — despite the courtesy title — their having the proper intention and their pronouncing the correct words of Consecration are immaterial.
- Wrong, because deacons, while having orders, do not have priestly orders, and laypeople have no orders at all. You need priestly orders to consecrate the Eucharist.
- Wrong, because *a* is correct.
