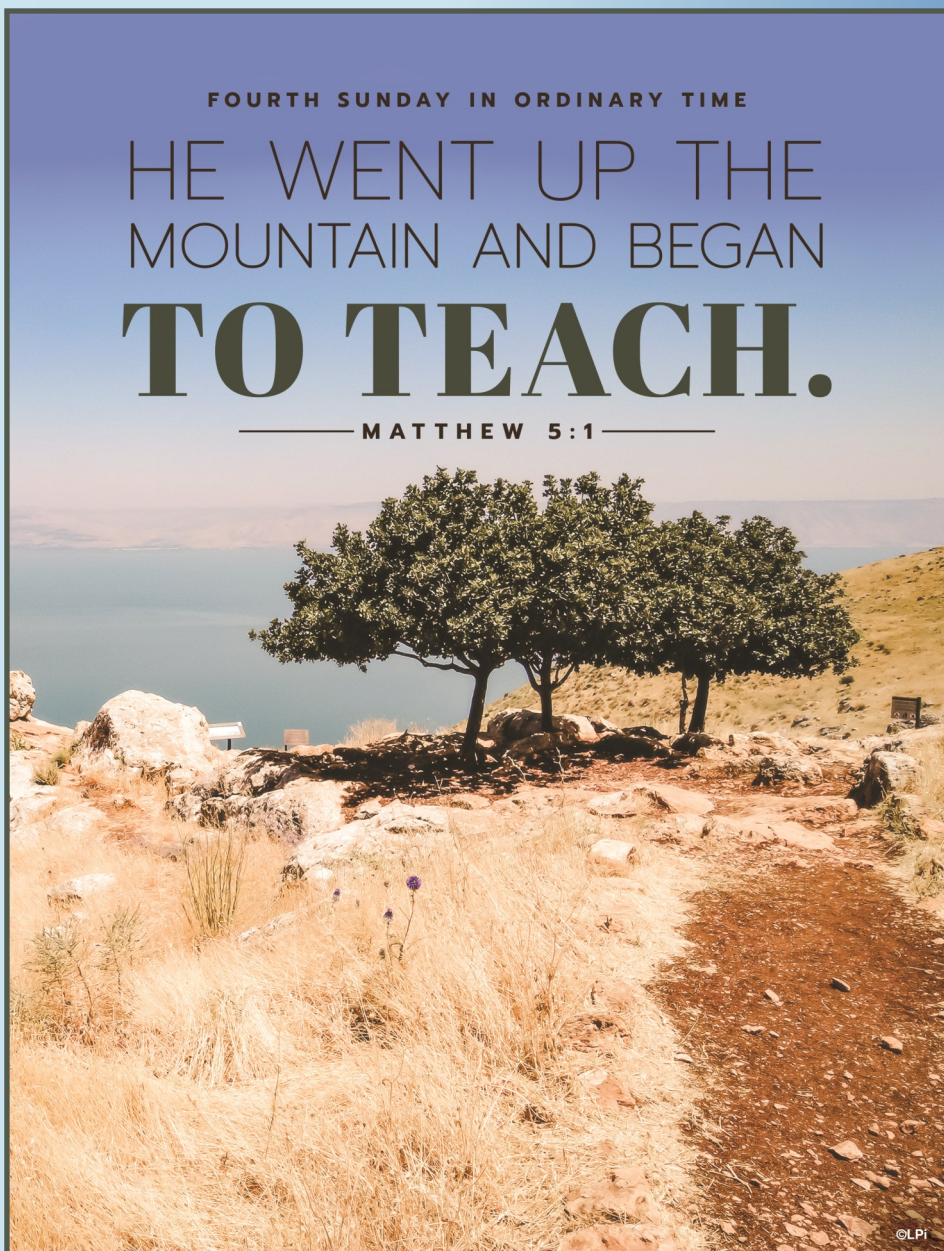
Membership includes active participation in the sacramental life of the Church, involvement in the activities of the faith community and financial support of the parish.

Dear Friends in Christ,

We have news that is difficult for us to share. We wish to let you know that we are preparing to leave Catholic Rural Ministry this year in June. We will be transitioning back to our religious communities: Benedictine Sisters in Erie for Sister Marian and Rhode Island Mercy Sisters for Sister Tina. As Religious we are now called to serve in other ministries.

As we wrap up our ministry in the Oil City Deanery we want you to know the deep gratitude and love we feel for the privilege of living and serving with/for you the past 19 years. The pastors and parishioners of this area welcomed us as we sought to be a loving presence among you. It has been a shared journey of faith and outreach since 2007 when Catholic Rural Ministry was called into being in this area. At that time, Sister Clare Marie Beichner, SSJ and Sister Marian responded to be "Women of Hope and God's Compassionate Presence" for the people here. In 2012 Sister Tina replaced Sister Clare Marie who was called to another ministry. Your warm welcome, supportive love and inspiring faith has been a blessing to us for which we are deeply grateful and will treasure always.

Please know that the Diocese of Erie is presently searching for Sisters to continue Catholic Rural Ministry in this area. Please join us in prayer that other Sisters will be open to this call and have the courage and energy to serve in the five counties of this deanery.

A prayer has been designed to ask God's help in finding Sisters to continue this work. We invite you to pray with us for this intention:

Dear Jesus, we thank you for the gift and presence of Women Religious in our church and world. We ask that you open the hearts of Sisters to serve the people of the Diocese of Erie and in particular, at this time, in the Oil City Deanery with their presence and the talents you have given them. We pray this in your name and according to your Divine Will.

St. Benedict and St. Scholastica, patron of Benedictines, pray for us... Blessed Catherine McAuley, founder of the Mercy Sisters, pray for us. Mother Agnes Spencer, founder of the Sisters of St. Joseph in the Erie diocese, pray for us.

We look forward to the coming months in which we will continue to be with you. Transitions are difficult for all involved, so may we support each other even as we pray for other Sisters to serve in this area.
