
Membership includes active participation in the sacramental life of the Church, involvement in the activities of the faith community and financial support of the parish.

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JASON – A blessed President’s Day Weekend to you and I hope that you enjoyed your Saint Valentine’s Day. Saint Valentine was a Martyr known to give letters signed “Love, your Valentine;” and offering the blessing of marriages during a time of great persecution of the Faith. He was an example of selfless love that in a world that did not want to know it (or God working through him). This weekend we continue to be challenged by the words of Jesus’ Sermon on the Mount as he calls us to holiness helping us to fulfill the law. What is holiness? It is “wholeness” that can only be given by the Father. All disciples are called to love like the father. That is what allows us to grow in holiness. Over the last few weeks Jesus, through this sermon, has offered us tangible ways to love as he calls us to. Again, he is not calling for perfection in the worldly sense, but in the sense of selfless love. How are you called to love selflessly today? You can only do so through holiness.

A reminder that this Wednesday begins the holy Season of Lent. Please join us for [Mass in person/livestream at 8:30 am or 6:00 pm](#). You can also participate at 4:45 pm at St. Richard’s in Ringersburg and 6:00 pm at St. Charles in New Bethlehem. You should’ve received or will receive via mail our offerings for the Lent and Easter Seasons (it is also available on our website). Remember it is not just about giving something up, but also doing something to let the Lord “School” you as the Opening Prayer of Ash Wednesday reminds us. Use the resources that we have such as the books in the Lobby, the Small groups, myparishapp, or the FORMED App (information in next week’s bulletin) as some of the many great ways to let the Lord love you in this Holy Season and to grow in Holiness.

Thank you for your openness and assistance to this year’s CSA Appeal. The video is also on our social media and website. You can also utilize the envelope in the pews to help you offer your gift this weekend. Remember, this appeal is not just about money, but about becoming a missionary to others. Pray how the lord is calling you to share his goodness with others in time, talent, and treasure.

Today we also offered the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick because of the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes (which is also the world day of prayer for the sick) celebrated a few days ago. Remember, you can receive this sacrament anytime throughout your life for any illness of body, mind, or spirit. Another great time to receive this sacrament is before surgery, awaiting a diagnosis, hospital stay, counseling, etc. My encouragement, however, both with the lack of priests, but also the urgency of time please do not wait until the last minute to receive this gift as a priest may not always be available for various reasons. Also, please don’t forget the following options for those who cannot drive to Mass and are homebound:

Eucharistic Visitors that visit homes/nursing homes weekly.

Monthly visits to homes/nursing homes the first week of the month by me.

This ministry to the homebound/nursing home keeps us connected to our brothers and sisters unable to drive and rely on others to help them. Please contact the Church

office to be added to this list. Please don’t forget to let us know if you are in the Hospital as they do not let us know. I will do the best that I can to make a visit pending availability.

I also hope that the men of our parish are planning on joining us for the 2232 Men’s Conference on Saturday, March 7 from 8a-1p. Remember that we are a satellite location. I hope that all men high school age into adulthood can join us. These days are a great reminder that none of us are alone in our faith journey. This also might be a great opportunity for Fathers/Sons/Neighbors/Uncles/college students/teams/etc. to share some time together. It is only a few hours with nationally known speakers, refreshment, opportunity for Mass and Confession. I always look forward to these days and hope you can join me that day! 


