Parish Membership

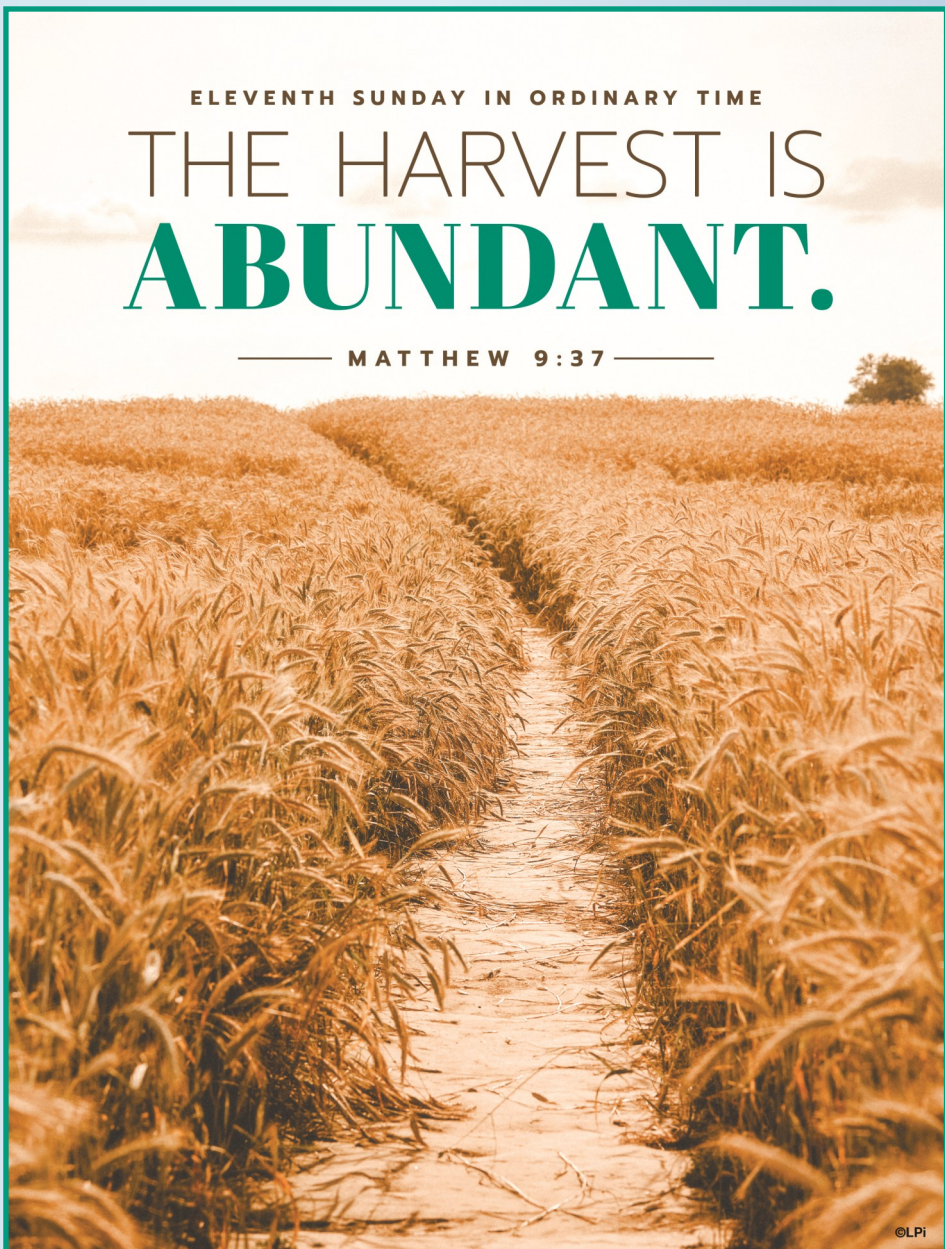
Membership includes active participation in the sacramental life of the Church, involvement in the activities of the faith community and financial support of the parish.

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JASON – A blessed Sunday to you as we enter into Ordinary Time! However, don't let the name of this season take your focus off of the good He wants to do with you that has begun in the Lenten/Easter Seasons! The name *Ordinary* should challenge us to continue to grow in the teaching, miracles, and life of Jesus Christ in the everyday moments, so they become extraordinary by his grace! Please see a few reminders below as we venture into this time:

- 250 hours of Adoration:** As stated in last weekend's bulletin, we hope to offer many opportunities for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at the request of our Bishop in honor of and prayer for our great Nation. Although we are going to do our best in achieving this over the next year, we also unite our times of Adoration to help our diocese offer 250 hours total over it's 13 counties. Upcoming Adoration opportunities are: **June 15: 8a-Noon; June 18: 5:30p-6:30p (with Benediction); June 26: 8a-Noon.** Remember what I said last weekend, the Lord only wants your presence with his. You do not have to come having everything about your life or how to spend that time figured out, but come to spend some time in conversation with him in thanksgiving and petition, but also asking to listen for his will in your life and our parish! There will be further resources available during these times as well if you wish.

- Sacred Heart Consecration next weekend:** If you didn't get a chance to join us last week for the consecration to the Sacred Heart, there will be an opportunity at the conclusion of our weekend Masses next weekend.
- July 4:** Independence Day is quickly approaching. Historically, when July 4 falls on a Saturday, evening Mass attendance is low. **Therefore, on SATURDAY, JULY 4 we will NOT offer our 4pm Mass (and 3pm Confessions)** to allow our ministers time with their families and to give myself and our visiting priests a brief reprieve. **All Masses on Sunday, July 5 (8:30am and 11am at IC; 10am at St. Charles; and 11:15am at St. Eusebius) will be offered at their normal time.** I appreciate your understanding.

- Picnic:** Plans are progressing for our Picnic as a Parish on August 2. Please mark you calendar as more information will be following!
- 11am Mass next weekend:** Because of the bulletin deadline/clergy availability, our 11am Mass may be 10-15 minutes late on June 21 because I am having difficulty finding coverage for Mass at 10am at St. Charles and may be offering both 10am and 11am masses...thank you for your continued patience!

I hope you have a wonderful week as I will be away the majority of next week at a Conference. Please pray for me as I am for you and know how much I appreciate your presence in my life as my parish family!

The Power of a Simple Action by Tracy Earl Welliver

I remember seeing a story on a morning news program
about a little girl who wanted to give an elderly man in a
grocery store a hug. She had no way of knowing that this
man had just lost his wife of many years and now felt so
very alone and depressed. Her reaching out to the man
seemed odd to her mom at first, but the girl was so insistent
about giving a hug she moved the shopping carts close
together so the exchange could take place. No one knew
that from that moment on the little girl would ask to visit
her new friend at least once a week for the next four years
until he passed away. In an interview soon after the initial
encounter, the man said, “I haven’t been this happy in some
time.” Imagine the joy that relationship brought to them
both over the years!

It was just a moment. It was a simple gesture. Yet, it had a
large impact that no one could have predicted. You never
know what will result when we give just a little of
ourselves. That uncertainty too often leads us to hold back
or refrain from the simple actions of love or gestures of
generosity that could come so easily for us if we wanted.
We should never doubt the power of a simple random act
of kindness. Generosity does not need to be grand to make
a big difference. The time is now, and the opportunity
presents itself often to plant a small seed that God can
water and nourish so that something beautiful can grow.
