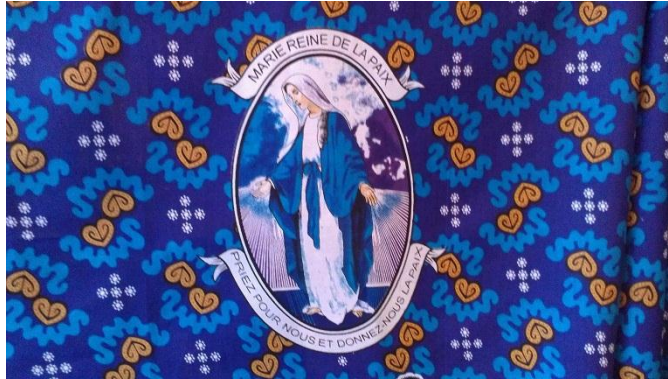


Art & Environment
