
### **MISSION STATEMENT**

On this **24**<sup>th</sup> **Sunday in Ordinary Time** we are reminded of our need to forgive. This is no surprise to those of us who pray the Lord's Prayer daily, asking God to "Forgive us our trespasses/debts as we forgive our trespasses/debtors."

Today's first reading from the Book of Sirach helps us recognize the inner tension we humans endure. We often want revenge, as we "hold tight to wrath, anger, and unforgiveness." Sirach urges us to remember that we will die and be held accountable for our sins. With this in mind he reminds us to let go of hatred and "overlook the faults of others". (Sirach 27:30-28)

St. Paul in his letter to the Romans reminds us that we belong to the Lord; in both life and death we should stay close to the Lord following his example of forgiveness. (Rom 14:7-9)

Jesus has set the bar high. We can never stop forgiving, since we expect God to forgive us as we forgive others. Like Peter we may ask how often must we forgive. Jesus' reply is the same for all of us: "I say to you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times." The #7 is infinite. Thus, there is no limit to forgiveness! (Mt 18:21-35)

This "Gospel/Good News" is for each of us, who hope to be forgiven and eventually enter the place of glory prepared for us by God in Christ Jesus.

### LET US SEEK THE LORD'S HELP

- Which is harder: To ask forgiveness, accept forgiveness, or grant forgiveness?
- ♦ Today I will let go of anger and old hurts, asking for the Holy Spirit's help.
- Today I will offer a helping hand, a smile, a prayer for someone who disturbs my inner peace.
- This week I will make room for grace and growth in my relationships?



### PROPER POSTURE FOR RECEIVING JESUS IN THE EUCHARIST

- Bow as you approach the minister to receive Jesus in the host and/or the cup.
- As you look at the Eucharist, speak an audible, deliberate "AMEN", thereby professing your belief in the real presence of Jesus. "AMEN" is the response, NOT "thank you".
- Receiving the Eucharist in your hands or on your tongue are options.
- Make a throne of your hands, lifting your hands to receive Jesus' in the host.
- Hold the chalice with reverence, drink, and then present it back to the minister.
- If you are not able to receive Eucharist, but want to receive a blessing, step forward with your arms crossed over your chest and the minister will extend a hand of blessing.



Child Labor Isn't in the Past

I recently took my family to a favorite hometown attraction, the Lackawanna County Coal Mine Tour. I grew up in Scranton, Pennsylvania, where anthracite mining was once a major industry, and the coalmine tour gives contemporary residents a glimpse of what their ancestors endured underground.

As a child, I was fascinated by stories of kids at work in the mines: breaker boys, nippers, mule drivers. But this time, holding my youngest child's hand in the dark, chilly tunnel, I shuddered as our guide described the routine tragedies of mining life: children losing fingers and limbs, or losing a father to a cave-in and having to go to work to replace him. She explained the economic system that attracted and then bound the families who lived in company housing, bought their necessities from company stores, and got as little for their labor as the bosses could get away with.

I came to the surface grateful for unions and labor laws, for school and all the other enriching opportunities that fill my children's days. I picked up the book, <u>Growing Up in Coal Country</u> by Susan Campbell Bartoletti, to fill out my children's notions of life in the unenlightened past. And then I read a <u>story</u> in the <u>Washington Post</u> about how, in 2023, there are state legislatures rolling back restrictions on child labor.

Reporters Jacob Bogage and Maria Luisa Paul tell of efforts to relax child employment regulations that are gaining ground in several states. The Iowa assembly passed a law that allows fourteen-year-olds to work the night shift and fifteenyear-olds to work on assembly lines. In Arkansas, children under sixteen no longer need to obtain work permits or have their ages verified by employers. The talking points supporting these laws are always about parent's rights and freedom from government intrusion, and supporters talk about teens who want to work a few hours after school to gain valuable experience and build character. Nick Stehle, a vice president of a political action committee told the *Post* his organization advocates "removing the permission slip that inserts government in between parents and their teenager's desire to work." That sounds swell, until you remember why the government got between kids and their prospective bosses in the first place.






