
#### **MISSION STATEMENT**

**SUNDAY, OCTOBER 15, 2023** 

On this **28**<sup>th</sup> **Sunday in Ordinary Time** God has promised us a glorious feast high on Mt. Zion, where tears and death are banished, and "juicy rich food and pure choice wines" have been prepared.

Today's Psalm 23 presents a similar picture of verdant pastures where we are given "repose and refreshment" as we enjoy "the table spread before [us]". Here the Lord invites us to dwell in His house of "goodness and kindness" forever.

- Does my desire for eternal life with God prompt me to live a virtuous life?
- I will praise and thank God for his promised gift.

In today's Gospel, Jesus' parable of the generous king causes concern, since the invited guests have refused his invitation. In his eagerness to share the glorious feast, the King invites outsiders. Many come, but one person arrives unprepared and is cast out. Jesus offers us a shocking picture of both disinterested and unprepared individuals.

The good news is that we have all been invited to vibrant membership in the Kingdom of God and the heavenly feast. Surprisingly, many, having been distracted by a variety of options, are totally disinterested in God's offer.

- ♦ Am I eager to receive God's gifts?
- Do I respond by living according to Jesus' law of love?

The garment of virtuous living is necessary to be admitted into the king's feast.

Does the Christian ethic of moral living influence how I live my life?

Jesus gave his life that we might live, not by basking in creature comforts, but by allowing His life, love and right judgment to fill us. Jesus has brought heaven down to earth...but it seems that we have stopped wanting it...we've stopped desiring a Christian society, a society of life-giving love and mercy.

Having been caught in the materialism of this age, many Christians are settling for too little. It is time to seek God's Kingdom where mercy, love, justice and peace reign.

By neglecting to do so, we will end up like the man who was bound and cast into darkness. Now is the time to take action. It is time to stoke the flame of truth revealed in Jesus. This ardent love has already been ignited in the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and so we pray...

#### INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR THE ERADICATION OF POVERTY

The International Day for the Eradication of Poverty is an international observance celebrated each year on October 17<sup>th</sup> throughout the world. The first commemoration, "World Day to Overcome Poverty" took place in Paris, France in 1987 when 100,000 people gathered on the Human Rights and Liberties Plaza at the Trocadero, to honor victims of poverty, hunger, violence, and fear. It was at this gathering that Fr. Joseph Wresinski, the founder of the "International Movement ATD Fourth World, unveiled a commemorative stone that remains in the plaza to this day. In 1992, four years after Fr. Wesinski's death the United Nations officially designated October 17<sup>th</sup> as the International Day for the Eradication of Poverty.

Early in his career as an activist, Fr. Wresinski recognized that governments often ignored the plight of those living in poverty, leading to feelings of rejection, shame, and humiliation. As a result, one of the primary goals of the Day is to recognize the struggles of the impoverished and to make their voices heard by governments and citizens. Participation by the poorest of people is an important aspect of the observance of the Day.

The October 17<sup>th</sup> Commemorative Stone, that Fr. Wesinski unveiled at the Trocadero Plaza in 1987 is recognized as a symbol of humanity which enshrines his words:

"Wherever men and women are condemned to live in extreme poverty, human rights are violated. To come together to ensure that these rights be respected is our solemn duty."

To date a total of 53 replicas of the stone are in countries around the world and also at the Council of Europe in Strasbourg, and at the United Nations in New York.

The International Day for the Eradication of Poverty promotes dialogue and understanding between people living in poverty and their communities, and society at large. "It represents an opportunity to acknowledge the efforts and struggles of people living in poverty, a chance for them to make their concerns heard and a moment to recognize that poor people are in the forefront in the fight against poverty." (United Nations, Report of the Secretary General).

Launched in 2008, the International Committee for October 17<sup>th</sup>, promotes the Day in its founding spirit. Every year, the Committee engages in a consultation process through the Forum on Overcoming Poverty to select a theme for the annual observance of October 17<sup>th</sup> by the UN with input from people with lived experience of poverty. The current theme is, "Dignity For All In Practice."
