MISSION STATEMENT

We The people of the Whiting/Robertsdale Cluster, are a Catholic Faith Community, ethnically rich, culturally diverse, and one in Faith. Inspired by the unity of The Holy Trinity, we endeavor to share our Faith as disciples of Jesus.



Annually on **October 21**st, **the Missionaries of the Precious Blood**, who have served St. John parish for over 100 years, **celebrate the feast day of their founder, St. Gaspar del Buffalo.** Fr. Gaspar, a young spirit-filled 19th century Italian priest longed to follow in the footsteps of St. Francis Xavier as a missionary in distant lands.

In 1809 Napoleon was demanding that leaders of all sorts swear allegiance to the emperor. Gaspar stood firm in his faith, refusing to take the prescribed oath: "I must not, I cannot, I will not!" was his mantra. Although it meant imprisonment and harsh punishment, Gaspar, counted on the blood of Jesus to fortify and strengthen him.

After returning from imprisonment and exile, Gaspar wanted to join the recently reestablished Jesuits. However, Pope Pius VII had other needs and asked Gasper to be a missionary right on his own Italian turf, converting the local outlaws of small Italian towns.

Armed with a large crucifix, Gaspar courageously ventured into the civil unrest. There he spoke so passionately of Jesus' mercy and love, that the hearts of hardened criminals were softened. Remorseful, they confessed their sins, gave their lives to the Lord, and returned to the sacraments. To this day the tiny mountain town of Sonino, Italy gratefully remembers Fr. Gaspar, whose vibrant love for Jesus and the gospel saved them and their town from total destruction.

Fr. Gaspar shared his devotion to the blood of Jesus wherever he ministered, gathering likeminded individuals, who shared a love for Jesus and His most precious blood.

Subsequently, and to the dismay of some contrary religious leaders, Gaspar gained the Pope's permission to establish a religious congregation of men under the title of the *Congregation of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood*. Eventually several groups of religious sisters also were founded and inspired by the devotion to the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ.

Today there are Precious Blood priests, brothers, sisters, and lay Companions, throughout the world; their mission is to live the spirituality of the Precious Blood. They have responded to "the call and the cry of the blood" as they embrace the spirituality of Jesus' healing, empowering Precious Blood.

Here in Whiting as well as throughout the world, CPPS members and Companions have heard *call of Jesus' Precious Blood* encouraging them to follow and live the mercy of Jesus' Precious Blood. Likewise, they have recognized the *cry of Jesus' blood*, which continues to be shed in myriad ways through domestic violence, abject poverty, violence, war and all manner of abusive behaviors. Fortified with the Precious Blood of Jesus, they are compelled to pray daily and to work diligently for healing wherever and whenever the *call* and/or the *cry* of Jesus' Precious Blood beckons.



PEACE AND SOCIAL JUSTICE

WITHSTANDING OTHERS ATTEMPTED MANIPULATION

The manipulation of people, such as the attempted manipulation of Jesus in today's Gospel, has gone on since the beginning of time. The Pharisees' manipulations, however, were no match for Jesus. There may have been times in our lives when we became aware that flattery was being used on us to help win us over to an issue or to gain an ally. It is so very human. The Pharisees used it hoping that Jesus would fall for it and allow his ego to get the better of him, thus trapping himself in the process. It is so easy to do. How many times have we said yes to things we should have said no to, simply because flattering words were spoken?

Jesus invites us all to become single-minded. If we keep our eyes on Christ and allow ourselves to be guided by his Spirit, we will be able to withstand the pressure of manipulations that can come our way.

Most of us will not often encounter the clever manipulations of people like the Pharisees. Some of us, however, unfortunately will. The primary message in today's Gospel is to turn our lives completely over to God and not allow anything to keep us from God's love. If however, we become encumbered by all of life's junk, we can become so blind and cluttered that there is no room left in our hearts for God. The space is already taken. If we free ourselves as Christ calls us to do, however, we won't need to worry when folks like the Pharisees come wielding their sinister plots.
