
### **MISSION STATEMENT**


holiday feast for all. Donations can be brought into church during the **collection dates of November 1**<sup>st</sup> - 17<sup>th</sup>.



### **TAKING OFF OUR MASKS**


This past week we celebrated Halloween, a day that precedes the Church's great celebration in honor of all the saints. Today's readings fit in with this dual observance of pretending to be something or someone (Halloween) and remembering those who really knew who they were (All Saints).

The Old Testament prophet Malachi and Jesus both speak challenging words to those leaders who have been pretenders. These leaders were given a sacred trust. Instead they put on costumes of importance and prestige and instead of serving others, they demanded service from others. Jesus' words are not only a warning to the religious leaders of His time, they also speak to all of us as well.

The problem with the Pharisees wasn't their interpretation of the Law to which they were very dedicated, but that they didn't practice what they preached. Jesus says, "Their words are bold, but their deeds are few." There is a bit of the Pharisee in all of us. We all have a gap between what we say and what we do. We hold our leaders to high standards (as we should) but we make many exceptions for ourselves. We expect competence from sales persons, professionals and fellow workers but excuse ourselves with great frequency. We write abusive letters of complaint to others but are ourselves easily insulted. We excuse little in anybody else but will always find an excuse for ourselves.

We can all use a healthy dose of humility. The one thing that is central to the lives of all the saints is humility. Every time we come to Mass, the Lord calls us to take off our masks and costumes and to let the Word of God work within us, to make our life a living Gospel for all people to hear and see. If there is a little bit of the Pharisee in each of us, there is also is a little bit of Christ in each of us. The question is, which one are we letting grow?

### PROPER POSTURE FOR RECEIVING JESUS IN THE EUCHARIST

- Bow as you approach the minister to receive Jesus in the host and/or the cup.
- ◆ As you look at the Eucharist, speak an audible, deliberate "AMEN", thereby professing your belief in the real presence of Jesus. "AMEN" is the response, NOT "thank you".
- Receiving the Eucharist in your hands or on your tongue are options.
- Make a throne of your hands, lifting your hands to receive Jesus' in the host.
- Hold the chalice with reverence, drink, and then present it back to the minister.
- If you are not able to receive Eucharist, but want to receive a blessing, step forward with your arms crossed over your chest and the minister will extend a hand of blessing.


