
MISSION STATEMENT

On this **32**nd **Sunday in Ordinary Time** we encounter readings, that encourage us to draw close to the Lord. **Wisdom 6:12-16** urges the reader to seek WISDOM depicted as a radiant woman – the feminine side of God - who aids us in becoming prudent, so that our many decisions will correspond with the will of God. This reading assures us that WISDOM is never denied to those seeking "her", and "she" is ready to assist us in every situation.

♦ In place of worry and anxiety, I will seek WISDOM.

Today's **Responsorial Psalm 63** gives to God high praise and glory for being ever present and ever powerful.

- ♦ Like the psalmist, I will make time for daily prayer.
- I will trust God and praise Him in every situation.

St. Paul in his letter to the Thessalonians reminds us that Jesus the Christ has won the victory over death, and because Jesus lives, we too will live with him in both the now and the hereafter of our lives.

- Do I trust that the Lord has prepared an eternal place for me, so that where He is I also may be? Am I prepared to meet Him?
- ♦ This week I will reread **Thess 4:13-18** and be encouraged.

The final chapters of Matthew's Gospel speak of the end times. As we experience autumn, the falling of leaves and the death of nature's summer beauty, we also view our own mortality. Jesus shares the parable of the 10 wise virgins. He compares the wise with the 10 foolish virgins. (Mt 25:1-13) Bottom line: Jesus urges us to "stay awake! For you know neither the day nor the hour."

- I will consider following Jesus and his way more perfectly.
- ♦ I will phone or visit someone to cheer them.
- I will share what I have with those in need.
- I will strive to live each day as if it were my last on earth.

May we, baptized believers, be attentive to the Sacred Readings of these final weeks of Ordinary Time. By living Christ centered lives, we ready ourselves to share the gift of eternal life with our risen Lord.

TEACHING UNDERSERVED KIDS TO READ THROUGH PLAY

Play is essential to healthy development in children, helping them grow cognitively, emotionally, physically, and socially. It's also a fundamental human right, per the United Nations. A grassroots nonprofit in Massachusetts is harnessing the power that play has to improve lives and taking it one step further by pairing it with education.

Founded in 2020, **Project: Play2Learn** partners with community organizations, educators, and pediatricians to provide free educational games to underprivileged children, including refugees and those experiencing homelessness. Its flagship offering, **Alphabet Zoop**, is an award-winning card game that promotes early literacy. There are various ways to play, and each deck comes with a QR code for translating it into 20 different languages.

The concept of **Alphabet Zoop** began with a simple idea: the number of letters in the alphabet, when doubled, matched the number of playing cards in a standard deck. Inspired by her love for playing cards with her grandmother, Priscilla Jane Ryder, the creator filed for a utility patent and brought Alphabet Playing Cards to life.

For 30 years **Alphabet Zoop** has been helping children learn pre-literacy skills through play at schools, homes, and libraries. "Busy families welcome our games ... as they are quick, easy, and fun," says Ryder, sharing that there's a math and STEAM-focused game coming out next. "One small sturdy card game in a box provides minutes or hours of family togetherness while learning."

Project: Play2Learn is a volunteer-run nonprofit that aims to expand its reach ... "with an end goal of helping more under-resourced children learn through play nationwide," says Ryder.

PROPER POSTURE FOR RECEIVING JESUS IN THE EUCHARIST

- Bow as you approach the minister to receive Jesus in the host and/or the cup.
- As you look at the Eucharist, speak an audible, deliberate "AMEN", thereby professing your belief in the real presence of Jesus. "AMEN" is the response, NOT "thank you".
- Receiving the Eucharist in your hands or on your tongue are options.
- Make a throne of your hands, lifting your hands to receive Jesus' in the host.
- Hold the chalice with reverence, drink, and then present it back to the minister.
- If you are not able to receive Eucharist, but want to receive a blessing, step forward with your arms crossed over your chest and the minister will extend a hand of blessing.
