As we mark the final days of the liturgical year, our Sunday readings urge us to think about the finality of our earthly lives. Eventually we will succumb to death. As Christians baptized into the death and resurrection of Jesus, we are urged to lives worthy of our calling, so that we may enjoy eternal glory when God calls us home. The “works of mercy” listed in Matthew 25: 31-46 and the “beatitudes” in Matthew 5:1-12 give us life’s blueprint.

- ◆ I will thoughtfully consider ways I can follow Jesus’ example of total self-giving.
- ◆ I will work at being reconciled with a relative, co-worker, neighbor.
- ◆ I will make do with less in order to offer financial support to someone who is struggling.

Today’s first reading from Proverbs 31 gives inspiration through a woman who embodies “wisdom”. Her competence, diligence, and generosity bless both her family and the community.

- ◆ I will make time to read from the books of Wisdom, Proverbs, and Sirach.
- ◆ I will ask the Holy Spirit to renew my heart and mind in order to live each day well.

In the second reading from 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6, St. Paul reminds us to live as “Children of the LIGHT”. This is no time for idle laziness. I may be called to my final judgment at any time! NOW is the time to prepare.

- ◆ Prayerfully I will draw close to God, endeavoring to live in God’s love, mercy, and joy.
- ◆ I will try to live each day as if it were my last.

Today’s Gospel, Matthew 25:14-30, presents Jesus’ parable of the talents. Those who have accepted their God-given gifts and used them for the benefit of others will rejoice together with God at judgement day. Those who do not are doomed!

- ◆ I will look to Jesus’ for direction and encouragement as I re-read the Gospel of St. Matthew.
- ◆ I acknowledge that I am a child of the LIGHT; I will be light as I share Jesus’ joy today and every day.

PEACE AND SOCIAL JUSTICE**OUR GOD GIVEN TALENTS**

In today's Gospel we have another sobering parable from the Lord about judgment and accountability. Three individuals are given a different number of talents. Two of them increase what they had. One did nothing with it and was condemned. The parable acknowledges that we are not born equally talented. Our national founding documents say that we are created equal in human rights but that does not mean that we are equal in abilities. We have different intellectual abilities and different physical strengths and skills. We are born with different social opportunities and advantages, different genetic inheritances. Like the servants in the Gospel, we are entrusted with different talents.

Our talents may not be spectacular, but they are real and important. We often look at people we feel are very "talented," and compare ourselves to them while minimizing the very real and worthwhile gifts we have. Because we can't sing a solo like some people, therefore we feel we shouldn't sing at all. Because we can't be a professional athlete like some people, therefore why join any team? Instead of using the talents we have, are we always dreaming about the ones we don't have? In other words, are we burying our talents?

Today's Gospel teaches us to live in a responsible and faithful manner, using the gifts God has given us to the fullest, right now, because there is an accounting each of us will have to give personally to the Lord at the end of our time here. Answering the question, what did we do with our talents? How did we make a difference in our day-to-day world?

PROPER POSTURE FOR RECEIVING JESUS IN THE EUCHARIST

- ♦ Bow as you approach the minister to receive Jesus in the host and/or the cup.
- ♦ As you look at the Eucharist, speak an audible, deliberate **"AMEN"**, thereby professing your belief in the real presence of Jesus. "AMEN" is the response, **NOT** "thank you".
- ♦ Receiving the Eucharist in your hands or on your tongue are options.
- ♦ Make a throne of your hands, lifting your hands to receive Jesus' in the host.
- ♦ Hold the chalice with reverence, drink, and then present it back to the minister.
- ♦ If you are not able to receive Eucharist, but want to receive a blessing, step forward with your arms crossed over your chest and the minister will extend a hand of blessing.
