
### **MISSION STATEMENT**

On this first Sunday of Advent our scripture readings call for the conversion of hearts. The prophet Isaiah reminds the people of old and us to remember the wonders that God has done for us. As we do, our gratitude should increase, and a deeper relationship with God should result.

There is a sense of urgency in today's readings: be grateful, repent of wrongdoing, no longer live in darkness. Jesus tells us to "Be watchfull! Be alert! ... may he not come suddenly and find you sleeping".

God has given us everything we need to fulfill the mission of our baptism. It is up to us to continue putting our gifts and talents at the disposal of God, who calls us to be generous as he is generous. We have been made in His divine image for the magnanimous work of being Jesus' heart, hands, feet, and spokespersons in the world.

The first century Christians understood the urgency of gospel mission. Consequently, the Church grew in amazing ways. Sadly, many of today's baptized have lost the fervor so necessary for effectively sharing with others the good news of God's merciful love.

If we, the Church, are to triumph over the darkness of the world, then we, the Church, must respond to God's call. This involves taking time to listen to God who speaks to us in a variety of ways through his word, the sacraments, others, and life's events.

The Holy Spirit, whom we have received at baptism, inspires, enlightens, and empowers us. It is up to move from our comfort zone and trust that the Spirit will guide us. The time is now to enter the ranks of the saints of earth. Let us remain alert and watchful while we work and pray, because God may come when least expected to take us to our eternal home.

### **ADVENT BEGINS**

We have retired the green vestments of Ordinary Time and have draped our church with Advent purple. In our northern hemisphere the climate has become cloudy, dark, and cold; interestingly the new church year begins in" darkness" as we await the second coming of **JESUS OUR LIGHT**.

The name "advent" has a Latin root, "adventus" (coming), and refers to Christ's coming into the world:

- Christ came in history with his historical birth;
- He comes daily in the various events of our lives; and
- **He will come again** in the *Parousia* at the end of time.



#### **ADVENT**


Advent symbolizes our human condition. We long. We hope. We rejoice in what we have. We yearn for what we don't have. Even nature conspires during Advent time to make us feel our human incompleteness. As the darkness of winter descends, we long for the light. As cold numbs us, we yearn for the warmth of God's love. As plants and leaves die, sometimes with a final flash of brilliance, we hope for resurrection and new life. The Lord is about to create something new. Isaiah cherishes this theme. He repeats it again and again. "See, I am doing a new deed, even now it comes to light: Can you not see it? Yes, I am making a road in the wilderness, paths in the wilds."

During this Advent, one of the signs of our trust in the Lord, and our self-gift to Him, would be our faithfulness to personal prayer daily, even in the midst of our multiple activities. With profound confidence in the Lord's continuous presence, pray that when He comes, He finds us watching in prayer, our hearts filled with wonder and joy.

# Looking for a Christmas Present for Someone Who has Everything?


