
MISSION STATEMENT

"Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus."
(1 Thes 5:16)

Everything about the **Third Sunday of Advent** proclaims *joy* at the wonders of our God. In the first reading the prophet Isaiah heralds the good news of our God bringing glad tidings to the poor, healing the brokenhearted, proclaiming liberty to captives and setting prisoners free. Thus, a year of favor from our God graces the world.

In place of the usual Psalm Response, we sing from Mary's *Magnificat*, thereby giving our witness to the readings:

"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior."

The second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Thessalonians, exhorts us to let go of all anxiety and draw close to the Lord with a grateful heart.

- ♦ To what fears, tensions, anxiety do I cling?
- This week I will entrust my problems to the Lord, trusting in his help.
- ♦ With Mary can I sing God's praise, acknowledging that He has come to me in my time of need?
- I will let go of my own wants as I assist the poor through our local SVDP, Whiting Food Pantry, Salvation Army and other outreaches.

Today's Gospel (John 1:6-28) highlights John the Baptist, as he quotes Isaiah:

"I am the voice of one crying out in the desert.

Make straight the way of the Lord."

Each of us must voice John's proclamation; since we, baptized Christians, are anointed with the task of preparing the way of the Lord.

Christmas carols, Advent wreaths, Christmas trees, Midnight Mass— Whether they are family or Church customs, the many traditions of the Advent & Christmas seasons are special times for us.

An ancient Christian tradition is the reciting or singing of the *O Antiphons* at Evening Prayer to introduce the *Canticle of Mary* ~ **December 17 to December 23**, the octave before Christmas.

We sing these antiphons in our Advent hymn *O Come, O Come, Emmanuel*. They are based on Isaiah's prophecies and refer to the different ancient titles given to the Messiah:

- O Sapientia (O Wisdom) See Isaiah 11:2–3; 28:29.
- O Adonai (O Lord) See Isaiah 11:4-5; 33:22.
- O Radix Jesse (O Root of Jesse) See Isaiah 1:1; 11:10.
- O Clavis David (O Key of David) See Isaiah 9:6; 22:22.
- O Oriens (O Rising Sun) See Isaiah 9:1.
- O Rex Gentium (O King of the Nations) See Isaiah 9:5; 2:4.
- O Emmanuel (God with us) See Isaiah 7:14.

We can bring these responses into our own prayers: as daily reminders of the one whose coming we joyfully expect; as introductions to our prayers of praise of Jesus; as words of thanksgiving for God's faithfulness to us and to all mankind.

Regardless of how you incorporate these ancient words into your Advent prayer life, let them speak to you, and maybe they can become part of your family traditions.

JOHN THE BAPTIST

John knew the Advent secret: He focused his whole life on the coming of Jesus. He realized that his all-consuming vocation was to prepare the way of the Lord. Our own vocation is very similar; the person of Jesus must be absolutely central in our lives. We must seek to share in His love and reverence for the Father and His compassionate and effective love for the poor. With Jesus we must trust in God's providence, which rules over all.

John the Baptist's life makes it very clear that the following of Christ involves a demanding self-discipline that leads to the avoidance of all forms of indulgence. John knew how to focus attention not on himself but on the Lord whom he served. He knew humility, and the ground for the enormous freedom that humility gives. A humble person recognizes that all the good done by him/her comes from God. Power, prestigious positions, the praise of others, wealth - all these mean little to a truly humble person. Humble people recognize their own gifts and their own limitations. During this Advent, let us work hard to acquire the virtue of humility. Ask God constantly that He be pleased to give us the virtue of humility.
