
MISSION STATEMENT

To ingest Jesus means that He is now in us, transforming us into his own holy men and women, his children. Henceforth, our attitude, our words and actions must be conformed to that of our Savior, as we respond "Thanks be to God" at the final command to "Go in peace to love and serve our Lord and each other."

Today and at every liturgy may our hymns, sung wholeheartedly, and our vibrant *Alleluia's and Amen's be a blessing to others and to our God on high*.

On Christmas and always may we give to Jesus, our incarnate God, whose birth, life, death and Resurrection have saved us, the gift of full and active worship at the Divine Liturgy, the Mass.


