
MISSION STATEMENT

Our God, who is Father, brother, and source of inspiration to us, invites us to use the gift of our imagination as we rest in the presence of the Almighty. The word heard throughout Advent was EMMANUEL ~ GOD WITH US. The sacred scriptures are filled with imagery, that invites all our senses to be saturated with GOD's presence.

The Epiphany readings beckon us to hear the ancient stories with fresh ears, and see the action with fresh eyes, allowing ourselves to be blest at the core of our being. As we take time to pray, reflect, and listen to God speaking to us, may we come to a deeper recognition and understanding of God's magnificent power and merciful love which inundates our lives.

HOUSE BLESSING

This year the **Feast of the Epiphany** is celebrated on **Sunday**, **January 7**th. The following prayers are to be used when blessing your home. **Holy water and chalk are available at both our cluster churches.**

We hope that families will continue this custom of blessing their homes in the New Year. By doing so we continue the ancient custom inspired by the Magi's visit. May our homes always be places of welcome, and may the peace of Christ be shared by all who dwell therein.

HOUSE BLESSING PRAYER

Leader: Peace, be to this house and to all who enter and dwell here.

All: Now and forever.

Leader: (We bow our heads and pray for God's blessing.)

O Lord, God Almighty, we ask that you bless this house. May it be a hallowed dwelling where health, chastity, victory over sin, strength, humility, goodness of heart, gentleness, and full observance of your law reign, as we daily express our gratitude to YOU \sim Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Leader/ family member marks with chalk above the doorway the following symbols:

$$20 + C + M + B + 24$$

(Initials of the three kings, **C**asper, **M**elchior, and **B**althazar)

May we who live in this house and all who come to visit, to work, and to relax, remember these things throughout the year. May all who enter here find peace, comfort, joy, hope, love, and salvation, for Christ has come to dwell in this house and in our hearts. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Optional: Everyone may process from one room to another, while each room is sprinkled with holy water, as we pray: "Bless this room, O Lord, or (i.e. Bless this kitchen and those who prepare the food... Bless this bedroom and keep all safe who sleep here, etc)."

After blessing the house a simple meal may be enjoyed together.

- At the council level event, each contestant receives 3 warm -up tosses followed by 15 consecutive free throw attempts at the appropriate age-designated foul line.

PEACE AND SOCIAL JUSTICE



THE MAGI

The Magi story is our story and that is why we're so taken by it! Their timeless tale follows the storyline of everyone. In a very real sense, we were all born with a vocation, a calling, a goal. It may be to become a mechanic, an engineer, a priest, a teacher, or whatever. The goal may be to find one's true love, a rewarding job, a life filled with adventure, a truthfilled life. For the three Wise men it was to find the "King of the Jews." That was their mission, their journey, their search, and that is the search that we all share with the Magi.

On any journey, there are always obstacles. For the Magi there was Herod, the wicked king, who sweet-talked a lie to them. "Please, go find this adorable child you are seeking, and by all means, come back and tell me where he is, so I too, can adore this newborn King," With the knowledge that there will always be obstacles, we must ask ourselves, "What are the obstacles to our goal of searching for God in our lives?" Could it be the sweet-talking "lies" of commercials that try to convince us that we are what purchase and what we buy makes us what we are? Or, perhaps it is the world preaching that we don't need to have any spiritual goals, that all we need for happiness can be found here and now in this world? Or, could it be that the world is telling us that real happiness can be found in a bottle, in drugs, or in the lure of exciting sex on the internet? Such obstacles are the spiritual steroids that puff-up our own self-importance and desires, making us blind to the Gospel values.

But on our journey of faith, there are also "helps" for us. For the Magi, help came in the form of an angel who warned them not to return to Herod, but to "take another path." For us, we have our "moral" heroes and heroines – our parents and family members, teachers, priests, religious and our real friends – who have taught us by word and example "to take another path" – the path of Jesus and the path of faith. Another source of great help comes from our faith community – parish staff, fellow parishioners, and various committees and groups. Finally, we have the inspiration of the saints, those canonized and those living in our midst, also our community worship in prayer and the sacraments. The helps far outweigh the obstacles on our journey of faith.

But what really happens at the end of the journey? For the Magi it was to engage the sacred, to look into the face of Christ, and falling down to offer him their gifts, and to worship him. It's the same for us; to offer our gifts and talents, and to minister to Jesus – which we do whenever we feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, or shelter the homeless. When we do these things for the very least of humanity, we are doing them for Jesus himself.


