
MISSION STATEMENT

Today's readings call us to "wake up" and "listen" as God beckons us to seek His will for our lives.

In 1 Samuel 3:3-19 we hear how God calls a young boy. Not understanding that it's God calling him, Samuel first responds to his elder, who eventually instructs Samuel to be attentive and respond to God with the following reply:

"Speak for your servant is listening."

- Have I opened the ears of my heart to hear God speaking to me?
- As a parent do I share knowledge of God and encourage my children to listen to God and respond to him? HINT: My good example will influence my family.

Today's Responsorial Psalm 40 gives us words to live by:

"Here am I, Lord, I come to do your will."

St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians stresses the fact that we are held accountable for the ways in which we use our bodies. Our bodies are sacred, created for goodness, not to be given to perversions and immorality. St. Paul instructs that our baptized bodies are "temples of the Holy Spirit".

- Considering that my body is more sacred than sacred vessels used at Mass, do I give my body due respect, offering my daily thoughts and actions for the glory of God?
- Am I teaching my children respect for their bodies?
- ♦ Will I discuss with them ways to live a chaste life?

In today's Gospel (John 1:35-42) Jesus asks two individuals following him, "What are you looking for?"

They do not answer; instead, they ask their own question: "Teacher, where are you staying?",

to which Jesus replies, "COME and you will see."

- ♦ For what am I looking...health, happiness, a deeper faith?
- I will follow the apostles example, and come to know and follow Jesus in deeper ways this year.

When Andrew and John saw for themselves, they immediately went to tell others.

 My actions and words can bring others (family members, co-workers, friends) to a relationship with Jesus. I will share my faith.

Sacrament Formation Sessions

Confirmation 1st year students have a formation session on **Thursday January 18th at 6:00pm in the cafeteria.** Parents are not required to attend but you are welcome to if you so choose.

Confirmation 2nd year students have a session scheduled for Thursday January 25th along with their Sponsor at 6:00pm. Unfortunately the Winterfest was scheduled after this session and there is a conflict with meeting space. This meeting is now Cancelled and will be rescheduled to February 22nd at 6:00pm. Please mark your calendars.

1st Communion Formation Session is on February 8th at 6:00pm in the school cafeteria. Parent and student session. Baptismal Preparation Session will be held on February 15th at 6:00pm in the school founders room. Pre registration is required.

All fees for Faith Formation are now due. Please submit payment on Sunday with your child. If you have questions please reach out to my office.

Wednesday January 24th will be our Living Stations of the Cross Call Out Meeting in the Founders room of the school. Living Stations of the Cross is a prayer service held on Good Friday at 7:00pm. This service walks the attendees through the stations of the cross with the young people portraying the people who experienced this event in history. The prayer service has been taking place here at St John the Baptist Church for over 20 year. I encourage you to talk to your children about participation in this beautiful experience. Adults are welcome to participate as well. Practices will take place on Wednesdays from 2:00-3:30 from January 31st- Good Friday, excluding vacation days. There are a total of 30-50 participants in this service so much help is needed. Please consider coming to the Call out to hear more about the event. Children in 5th grade and up are welcome to come alone, younger students need an older sibling or parent to join them, unless prior communication has taken place.

As Lent quickly approaches there are some events coming up.

Annual Palm Burning will take place on Tuesday February 6th.

Please send your old palms with your child or bring the bag into the church and leave near the doors. The ashes collected during the burning are then used for Ash Wednesday signing of the cross on one's forehead.

Ash Wednesday is on February 14th. Mass schedule is 7:00am, 8:30am and 7:00pm at St Adalbert.



PEACE AND SOCIAL JUSTICE

GAZA - FACTS & FIGURES

- The Gaza Strip was formed after the 1948 Arab-Israeli War. Egypt administered the territory but Israel captured it in the Six Day War in 1967. Under a series of agreements known as the Oslo Accords signed between 1993 and 1999, Israel transferred security and civilian responsibility for Gaza to the newly-created Palestinian Authority. (CIA World Factbook)
- Gaza is 139 square miles, the size of Las Vegas but 3 times the population. (Washington Post)
- There are approx. 2.3 million Palestinians living in Gaza of which nearly 75% are under 25 years. The median age in Gaza is 19.2 years. (World Population Review & CIA World Factbook)
- Gaza City, the largest population center, is more tightly packed than New York City, with more than 650,000 people living in its 18 square miles. (Washington Post)
- Gaza's economy ranks 142nd of the countries of the world and unemployment is about 25%. For youth (ages 15-24) unemployment is around 40%. (CIA World Factbook)
- Approx. 53% of the population is in poverty, living on less than \$4.60/day. That is equivalent to 1.1 million people, including 400,000 children. 66% of the poor, or about 656,000 people are living in "deep poverty," living on less than \$3.60/day. (UN Office of Humanitarian Affairs)
- Gaza struggles with soil degradation; desertification; water pollution from chemicals and pesticides; salination of fresh water; improper sewage treatment; waterborne disease; depletion and contamination of underground water resources. (CIA World Factbook)
- In 2018 the Norwegian Refugee Council called Gaza "the world's largest open-air prison."
- * In the current crisis: Over 19,000 people have been killed; 52,000 injured. 60% of housing units have been damaged or destroyed. At least 3 churches and 88 mosques have been damaged and over 50% of educational facilities have been hit. The number of functioning hospitals has dropped from 36 to 18. And approx. 1.9 million people have been displaced.





ALTERNATE WAYS TO GET YOUR CHURCH BULLETIN

Type <u>DiscoverMass.com</u> into your browser. At the website, type the name of the church and address or zip code of the church bulletin you want to view - **St. John the Baptist 46394** and follow the prompts.
