




THE 18 TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's readings warn against greed, which is totally opposed to discipleship. A bystander, demanding that his brother share his inheritance, receives Jesus' instruction via a parable. Riches and possessions are temporary; you die and someone else gets the fruits of your labor. Jesus then exhorts his listeners and us to examine our attitude towards earthly "success" and "wealth". We are encouraged to invest in the things that will yield eternal rewards. Since all of us are doomed to die, and nothing in this world lasts forever, Jesus gives us his divine perspective: get rich toward God ~ give to the poor ~ only LOVE lasts.

Special Events for the Rosary Society starting in September 2025 through June 2026. When prepared and finalized, each member will receive a copy of this document.

Virtus Awareness Session

The Diocese of Gary is committed to protecting the most vulnerable, our children, young people, and vulnerable adults, through education, awareness, and procedures.

Our Diocese began the work of addressing the issue of child sexual abuse in the early 1990s. Bishop Melczek and the clergy of our Diocese at the time established the Sexual Misconduct Toward Minors and Others at Risk in July of 1993. To implement this policy and its revisions, a Safe Environment has been established to:

- Provide a safe and secure environment for children and young people in the faith communities within our Diocese of Gary
- Assist the Diocese in evaluating a person's suitability to work with children, young people, and vulnerable adults
- Satisfy the concerns of parents and staff members with a screening process
- Provide a system to respond to the victims and their families, as well as the accused
- Reduce the possibility of false accusations against clergy, employees, and volunteers

Requirements:

Our Diocese requires that all diocesan clergy, religious, international priests, employees, and volunteers who have contact with children, young people, and vulnerable adults complete the following requirements:

- 1. Register with VIRTUS Online
- 2. Attend a Safe Environment Training Session
- **3.** Background check and required document renewal every five years
- **4.** Complete 24 ongoing monthly VIRTUS online informational bulletins

Our sessions are posted in the Virtus Database- August 21st at 9:00 am and August 26th at 6:00 pm. More sessions will be added.

ALTAR SERVER TRAINING

Altar Server training is held twice a year. **Our first session will be held on August 27**th **at 3:00 pm** in the Church, and the next session, if necessary, will be held in January. I encourage you to speak with your children about considering this ministry.

Altar Servers assist the priest, deacon, and community during the Mass. They are important servants and a necessary ministry.

Altar Servers must have received their 1st Communion, be male or female, and be available during weekend mass times: Saturday 4:30 and Sunday 8:00 and 10:30. Adults are also welcome to train and serve in this ministry. Contact the rectory to sign up for this training.

PROPER POSTURE FOR RECEIVING JESUS IN THE EUCHARIST

- Bow as you approach the minister to receive Jesus in the host and/or the cup.
- As you look at the Eucharist speak an audible, deliberate "AMEN", thereby professing your belief in the real presence of Jesus. "AMEN" is the response, not "thank you".
- Receiving the Eucharist in your hands or on your tongue are options.
- Make a throne of your hands, lifting your hands to receive Jesus' in the host.
- Hold the chalice with reverence, drink, and then present it back to the minister.
- If you are not able to receive Eucharist, but want to receive a blessing, step forward with your arms crossed over your chest and the minister will extend a hand of blessing.

At the Consecration of the Mass the priest first prays that the power of the Holy Spirit will transform the elements of bread and wine. Then the priest elevates the sacred host followed by the chalice while saying Jesus' words: "Do this in memory of me."

Through the power of the Holy Spirit, simple elements of bread and wine have become the body and blood of Jesus. It is important to look up at this time and adore our Living God, hidden under the forms of bread and wine, as we silently pray,

"My Lord and my God!"

PEACE AND SOCIAL JUSTICE

THE VIRTUE OF SIMPLICITY

In his teachings Jesus always put an emphasis on the importance of developing the virtue of simplicity in one's life. Simplicity is speaking and acting always with God alone in view. God is touching our lives at every moment of the day, and we are touching Him. He is particularly close to us in the Church, in the Sacraments and in the poor. If we wish to be sensitive to the presence of God in our lives, we have to recall His presence frequently. We have to give ourselves moments of stillness and reflection in the midst of our work and our lives, so that we can become more conscious that it is in God that we live and move and have our being at all times.

We tend to think that we can provide for our own future, but the Gospel reminds us that the future is God's. What we struggle all our lives to learn is that life does not consist of possessions nor our perceived security, but of being possessed by God. We belong to God and He can demand an accounting of us at any time. The only security we truly possess is a loving relationship with God.




