The 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday, Jesus reminds us of the great commandment, the **Shema**

***Love the Lord your God with all your heart...being...strength...mind,
and love your neighbor as yourself.*** (LK 10:25-37)

In order to explain, Jesus shares the parable of the "Good Samaritan". Thus, Jesus emphasizes that we must treat others with generous mercy and actively LIVE the GOSPEL. When hearing the Gospel of the "good Samaritan", we usually consider both the negligent passers-by as well as the generous Samaritan. However, let's also consider the needy person who is disregarded by members of his own culture, while receiving immediate care from a concerned outsider.

- Did the wounded man resent the negligent priest & Levite?
- Did he show gratitude to the Samaritan?
- When I needed assistance, did I receive help?
- How did I show my gratitude?
- Was I able to pay it forward when an opportunity arose?

July is the Month of the Precious Blood of Jesus. Among the Priests, Brothers, Sisters, and Companions of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, we speak of the "Call of the Blood" and the "Cry of the Blood". Those who respond to God's invitation to love him whole heartedly have heard the "call of the blood of Jesus" to be his loving presence in our broken world. As we regard our broken world, we become very aware of the "cry of the blood" of innocent children, the homeless, the jobless, the elderly, the incarcerated, all who cry for God's mercy.

Looking within ourselves, we realize that we have each received God's merciful love on multiple occasions. Now in this Jubilee Year of HOPE, we recommit ourselves to living God's love. May we repent for the times we have neglected the needs of others; may we be grateful for the times we've been helped; may we be quick to respond to others' needs with generous hearts and hands.

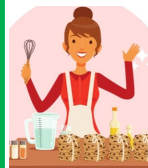

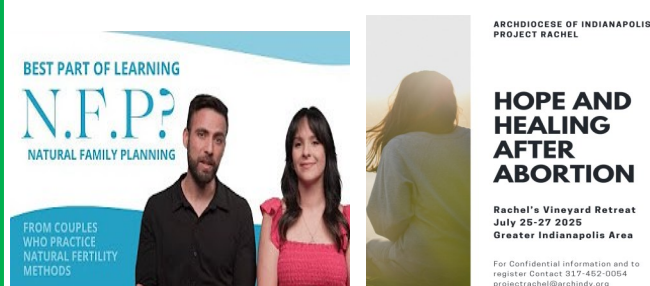

THE GOOD SAMARITAN REVISITED

It's always the powerless one who gathers the community, the Church. I recently discovered a new way to read the story of the Good Samaritan. I had always assumed that the Good Samaritan was the Christ symbol – and that's certainly one way to understand the parable. But from another point of view the real Christ symbol is the man lying on the side of the road.

The man lying on the side of the road is the one doing all the converting. He is the one who forces a whole new agenda, who takes your head off, shakes it and turns it upside down, puts it back on says, "This is what reality means."

The things we can't do anything with (the useless) and the things we can't do anything about (the necessary) are always the things that connect us to the Real. We'd sooner just be Catholics; we don't want the Kingdom! We'd sooner just be Americans; we don't really want to be a global, universal people! We'd rather protect our boundaries here; we're not ready for the big boundaries that Jesus calls us to. I'd have to empty too much of myself and make space for the not me, the other, the enemy.

The price of peace is truth. And it is the people left for dead on the side of the road who teach us that.
