#### THE 24TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

We are doubly blest that the **September 14th Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross** is celebrated on a Sunday this year. In the first reading from the Book of Numbers God's people complain of their desert hardships, so with Moses' intercession they are helped.

The second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians reminds us that Jesus, the perfect son of God, humbly gave himself up to a horrible death for all of us. Thus, God exalted him above all and gave him the name above all names, that at the name of Jesus "every knee shall bend and every tongue must confess that Jesus the Christ is Lord of all".

Today's Gospel celebrates the fact that "God so loved the world that he gave his only son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

#### ~ OUR RESPONSE ~

- Today reflect on the cross/crosses you are facing.
- How can you "take up your cross" this week?
- What will change in your attitude towards these trials?
- Place a cross where you will see it throughout the day, helping you to remember it is Jesus you are following and how you will follow him.

A blest way that we can give suffering its meaning is to offer up our pain for someone we know who is suffering greatly. We can ask Jesus to take the graces and merit from our suffering and use it to encourage or help someone else whom we love. This action not only unites us closer to Christ, but it also allows us to be united in the Body of Christ.

I ask you, today,
for the courage, strength, and humility
to follow Christ with the crosses

#### The Pope's intention for September:

For our relationship with all of creation. Let us pray that, inspired by St. Francis, we might experience our interdependence with all creatures who are loved by God and worthy of love and respect.



Catechetical Sunday is September 21st. This year's theme, "Always be ready to give an explanation...for a reason for your hope" (1Peter 3:15), is linked to the broader theme of the 2025 Jubilee year "Pilgrims of hope".

The theme emphasizes the duty of individuals to be witnesses of their faith and their hope in Christ. Catechetical Sunday is a day dedicated to recognizing and celebrating the role of catechists, those who teach the faith in the Church. It's a time when catechists are commissioned for their ministry and when the entire community is called to reflect on their baptismal call to share the faith. The day also provides an opportunity for all Catholics to rededicate themselves to the mission of passing on the faith.

#### **SCHOOL SHOOTINGS**

As bishops, we support measures that control the sale and use of firearms and make them safer – especially efforts that prevent their unsupervised use by children or anyone other than the owner – and we reiterate our call for sensible regulation of handguns and believe that in the long run and with few exceptions – i.e. police officers, military use – handguns should eventually be eliminated from our society. -U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops

- \*\* As of late July 2025, there have been **33** reported school shootings in the U.S. with **14** in K-12 schools and **19** on college campuses resulting in **15** deaths and at least **41** injuries. From: Gun Violence Archive

Mary is venerated under this title to commemorate the seven sorrows that she suffered: The prophecy of Simeon, the flight into Egypt, the loss of the child Jesus in the temple, meeting Jesus carrying his cross, the Crucifixion, receiving the body of Jesus from the cross, and the burial of Jesus. A devotional image of her shows her heart pierced with seven swords to represent these sorrows.

#### **ANNUAL ST. THERESE NOVENA**

You are invited to set aside nine days of prayer, beginning Tuesday, September 23 through Wednesday, October 1st, as St. John the Baptist Catholic Church hosts a public novena to St. Therese of Lisieux. The novena will be held in St. John Church each evening at 6:30 p.m. A social will follow in the church lot/garage on the final evening, Wednesday, October 1st.

This special devotion to St. Therese, the Little Flower began at St. John's in the late 1920's. Plans for a new St. John church building had been calculated, and construction had begun when the great depression struck. Our country was struggling and families were going through difficult times, but the parish didn't waiver in the face of the depression as they continued with their plans to build a church in spite of the obstacles.

Beginning in 1927, Fr. Kostik recommended that the entire parish pray through the intercession of the newly canonized St. Therese so that the proposed church would be built. With many personal sacrifices and countless prayers asking that St. Therese intercede for us, the present church building was completed. With gratitude a yearly novena was continued as a way of thanking St. Therese, who promised to spend her eternity praying on behalf of our world. Her personal writings reveal that through her intercession God's blessings would descend like a shower of roses!

St. John the Baptist Church and our Whiting/Robertsdale Community of Faith have been blessed. However, church attendance, which formerly filled our church each Sunday, has sadly dropped. At the recommendation of our pastor, Fr. Mark, we once again ask St. Therese to intercede for us. Through her intercession, we pray that God will guide our parish in a new evangelization; that God will show us how to bring back those who have lapsed from church attendance. With renewed hope we pray, knowing that God blest the physical building project in 1929, and now, in our time we pray that God will bless us with a spiritual renewal, as we endeavor to rebuild our parish community.

In October, we celebrate many feasts and special devotions.

We ask our October saints to pray for us:

- \* that those who have ceased coming to church realize that they are missed and return
- \* that through our prayers and example outsiders may find a home at St. John
  - \* that they and all of us may be renewed and sacramentally nourished

**St. Mother Theodora Guerin (Oct. 3),** founder of The Sisters of Providence, who served St. John and Sacred Heart schools for many years;


