



MARCH FOR LIFE. The Office for Evangelization sponsors an annual Diocesan-wide delegation to this year's March for Life in Washington DC on January 17-18, 2019. The March for Life marks the anniversary of the landmark decision of the Supreme Court in *Roe v. Wade*, which made abortion legal in the United States. The delegation is primarily intended for middle school, high school, college youth, and young adults. ST. ANTHONY FOOD PROGRAM AND BUILDING PROGRAM

Fr. Augustin extends his great gratitude to all who have helped feed the people in Pointe-à-Raquette, Haiti during the past year. Our monthly donation helps him feed and care for the residents of St. Anthony's House, and provide a hot cooked meal to other elderly or handicapped people who have no means to cook. In addition, raw food allotments of rice, beans, and oil are distributed to needy families. We hope to have pictures to share of the newly built St. Anthony House, that the residents moved into during the Christmas season. We are so grateful for the generosity of the parishioners of St. John's who have made this new, safe, greatly expanded building possible. Some work needs to be completed on the building such as furnishings for the additional rooms, possible installation of solar power, a water cistern system, etc., but as the Haitian proverb says: "piti, piti, wazo fe nich li," or little by little the bird builds its nest!
